Dear Town of Glastonbury:

As we previously informed you, Algonquin Gas Transmission, LLC (“Algonquin”) and Maritimes & Northeast Pipeline Company, L.L.C. (“Maritimes”), are proposing to develop the Atlantic Bridge Project (“Project”) to deliver approximately 153,000 dekatherms per day of critically needed additional natural gas supplies to areas in both southern and northern New England, as well as to specific end use markets in the Canadian Maritime provinces.

The Algonquin and Maritimes pipelines are interstate natural gas systems, and as such the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (“FERC”) exclusively authorizes the construction of new facilities including the modification of existing facilities. The FERC is also the lead federal agency responsible for conducting environmental reviews of interstate pipeline projects in compliance with the National Environmental Policy Act (“NEPA”). The FERC has established a pre-application process which provides stakeholders with an opportunity to review Project related information and identify issues before any permit applications are filed (the “FERC Pre-Filing Process”). The FERC assigned Pre-Filing Docket No. PF15-12-000 for the Atlantic Bridge Project on February 20, 2015.

During the FERC Pre-Filing Process, Algonquin, Maritimes and the FERC will seek input from landowners, government agencies, public officials and interested parties, and will work with them to identify issues related to the Project facilities. This process will allow us to address concerns before we file our FERC and state applications. As part of its Pre-Filing Process, the FERC is required under NEPA to evaluate concerns raised by the public about the Project and to consider the environmental impacts that could result from the proposed facilities. To that end, the FERC will hold meetings that are open to the public for comments on the Project.

The FERC scoping meeting in your area is scheduled to begin at 6:30 p.m., at the location listed below. In addition, Project representatives will be available starting at 5:30 p.m.

to meet with you and to answer any questions which you may have about the Project:

After Algonquin and Maritimes file the formal FERC application later this year, FERC will seek further public comment and then issue its Environmental Assessment ("EA") for the Project. A comment period will follow the release of the EA, providing opportunities for additional input from the public. FERC will review and consider all comments received on the EA and will then issue its decision.

We encourage all interested parties to participate fully in the FERC Pre-Filing Process.
