## What CAN be Recycled?

One of the biggest challenges with recycling is knowing which items actually belong in the trash or the recycling bin. Fortunately, the state of Connecticut has recently introduced a universal list outlining which items can and cannot be recycled called "What's In" and What's Out."

#### What's IN?

- Paper products: Cardboard, Boxboard (cereal, pasta boxes)
- ✓ Food and beverage cartons and jugs
- ✓ Pizza boxes
- Glass and plastic bottles and jars
- Metals: Aluminum foil/containers, aerosol food grade containers

Please be sure to rinse, clean, and empty all containers <u>before</u> depositing them in recycling containers.

### What's OUT?

Not recyclable through Town programs.

- x Plastic bags / wrap (Consult individual grocery stores for recycling options)
- x Straws, paper cups, and cup lids
- x Gift wrap / bags
- x Tissue
- x Ceramics
- x Prescription bottles
- x Styrofoam products

#### **Get Your Permit**

# **Town of Glastonbury Recycling Programs**

#### **General Recycling**

Residents may dispose of household recyclables (paper, cardboard, glass and plastic bottles, etc.), textiles, and leaves or grass at the Transfer Station. Permits are required for most items, excluding acceptable mattresses and electronics, which are recycled through the state of Connecticut Product Stewardship Program.

#### **Bulky Waste**

Dispose of brush, stumps, and construction or demolition materials at the Bulky Waste Facility.

#### **Compost**

Screened and unscreened compost and wood mulch are available seasonally at the Town's recycling facilities.

#### **Food Waste**

Food waste is the largest part of the waste stream and the least often recycled. To recycle this significant waste product and help save tax dollars, an enclosed container is available at the Transfer Station for discarding raw and prepared foods, coffee grounds, fats, and other food products. Food waste is converted into energy and, ultimately, a marketable, organic soil product.

# Do Your Part. Support Your Community. Reduce, Reuse, Recycle.

#### **ALWAYS...**

- Separate your recyclables
- Empty, rinse, and clean recyclables BEFORE depositing into bins
- Reuse and repurpose items
- Recycle plastic bags through local grocery store programs
- ✔ Bring reusable bags with you each time you shop! (Keep them in your car to ensure you always have them handy.)

#### **NEVER...**

- x Put plastic bags in recycling bins
- x Dispose of trash in satellite receptacles
- x Drop pet waste bags in storm drains
- x Dispose of Hazardous or toxic materials at the Transfer Station or trash receptacles
- x Shred, box, bag, or bundle items to be recycled

#### Share these rules with peers. Clean up after yourself & others. Help keep Glastonbury beautiful.

If you see a community member making a recycling faux pas, please inform them of the correct way to dispose of the item. Take the time to properly dispose of your trash/recycling items when out and about in the community and when possible, find ways to help pick up after others to contribute to a cleaner Glastonbury.

### **Seasonal Programs**

#### **Brush & Leaf Disposal**

Brush/leaf disposal days are held at the Transfer Station and Bulky Waste facilities each Spring and Fall.

## Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Collections

Dispose of acids, gasoline, insecticides, and other chemicals at the HHW events, which are held every Spring and Fall.

Proof of residency is required.

#### **Paper Shredding**

Paper-shred events are held periodically each year for disposal of sensitive documents such as bank statements and medical/tax records.
