It's fast, convenient, and 100% NACHA compliant. Simply select "e-check" as the payment option with your next on-line registration.

Did you Know?

There are approximately 1,300 youth, ages 8-18, that play in the Glastonbury Basketball Association including one hundred and forty-six recreation league teams and fifteen travel teams.

Collectively, they require 1,750 practices and 1,960 games using 2,600 hours of gym time over a 16-20 week period! Who says that Madison Square Garden is the mecca of basketball?

Firewood Anyone?

Yes, the Town does sell firewood! In the process of maintaining trees and eliminating hazards within the public right-of-way and on Town-owned lands, suitable hardwoods are salvaged, stockpiled, and seasoned before being sold to Glastonbury residents.

Here is how it works. Sold in 1/8 cord lots, the wood measures 16" x 3'x4'. The cost is \$20/lot. Residents can call Parks & Recreation to be put on the "wood list". As wood become available, residents are called and given ten business days to pick up the wood at the Parks & Recreation Department, 1086 New London Turnpike,

Monday-Friday, between 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.

The program is a good value and is a great way to keep the home fires burning on a cold winter night. It also helps preserve valuable space in the bulky waste site. Typically about 12-15 cord are sold each year to 100-120 Glastonbury residents.

The Parks & Recreation
Department is responsible for
the care and maintenance of all
trees located within the public
right-of-way. Routine tree work
includes trimming limbs and
branches that obstruct traffic

signs, interfere with the travel lane, obstruct sidewalks, and create sight line problems at intersections.

The Department also removes dead or dying trees that create

a hazardous condition within the right-of-way. Often times, private contractors are used when the trees are in close proximity to overhead utility lines.

Each winter the

Department, working in conjunction with the Highway Division, make a concentrated effort to perform needed tree maintenance as part of its "Street Tree Trimming Program". The program is underway. The list of streets scheduled for work is updated in the Glastonbury Citizen weekly.

Care and maintenance of public trees and the urban forest is coordinated by Greg Foran, Park Superintendent/Tree Warden. Several members of the Town's parks staff are State licensed arborists which ensures that all work is consistent with the best management practices in the field of arboriculture.
