*Voted*, That the appropriation, viz. (\$5,700), as recommended by the Joint Board of Education, be, and the same is hereby, appropriated to the schools for year ending July, 1892, and the following amount is set to each district, viz.:

*Voted*, That a tax of 15 mills on the dollar on list of 1891 (to be made) be, and the same is hereby, levied, to be due and payable on the first day of April, A.D. 1892, for the payment of the expenses of the town for the ensuing year, and to pay such portion of the town debt as may be deemed expedient by the Selectmen and Treasurer.

*Voted*, That the Treasurer be, and he is hereby, authorized to borrow on the faith and credit of the town a sum not to exceed ten thousand dollars, at an interest not to exceed four (4) per cent.

*Voted*, That the sum of fifty dollars be, and the same is hereby,

appropriated to the committee having in charge the celebration of Memorial Day.

*Voted*, That the Selectmen be authorized to drain the road from the Meadow road which leads to the Point (so-called) north to Muddy Brook.

*Voted*, That the School Visitors shall put into their next annual report the name and age of each person between the ages of 4 and 16, according to the preceding enumeration, with the number of their district, and the number of days each attended school each term.

*Voted*, That no person not a resident of this town shall be allowed to peddle within the town limits anything except farm products of their own raising, or goods manufactured by themselves, without the payment of a license fee fixed by the Selectmen, and such licenses to be granted at their discretion; and that the penalty for the violation of the same shall be five (\$5) dollars for each offense. Grand Jurors are instructed to prosecute the same, and a refusal to show their license to a Grand Juror or Constable shall incur the penalty of peddling without a license.

*Voted*, That the consideration of the report made by the Selectmen in regard to the drain between the church and the brook be, and the same is hereby, laid over until the next annual town meeting.

*Voted*, That the sum of \$200 be, and the same is hereby, appropriated to the Glastonbury Academy for the ensuing year.

*Voted*, That the sum of \$300 be, and the same is hereby, appropriated for the support of a select school at South Glastonbury for the ensuing year.

*Voted*, That a committee be appointed to consider the whole matter of highways, and report some system of working the roads at a future meeting; and that a committee of three (3) be appointed by the Moderator to nominate a committee of five (5). Said committee were appointed, viz.: Messrs. James B. Williams, John E. Tryon, and Norman W. Strickland. The committee reported the following named gentlemen, which were accepted, viz.: Bernard T. Williams, William Warner, Arthur M. Brainard, George C. Andrews, and David H. Carrier.

*Voted*, That when this meeting adjourns it be until four (4) weeks from this date, and that this committee be ready to report at that time.

We, the undersigned residents, taxpayers, and legal voters in the town of Glastonbury, having occasion to travel and haul loads over Jones Hill (otherwise known as Wickham Hill), do hereby petition said town of Glastonbury to authorize the lessening of the grade of said hill, by lowering it at least six feet at the highest point, and grading to a suitable distance, both on the eastern and western slope; and that the Selectmen, or a special committee appointed for that purpose, be instructed to execute this plan at the expense of said town.

GLASTONBURY, Sept. 19, 1891.

The above petition was signed by William C. Hills and ninety-six (96) other legal voters of said town; and it was

*Voted*, That said petition be referred to the Selectmen, with power to act.

*Voted*, To adjourn until four (4) weeks from to-day (Nov. 16th), at 10 o'clock A. M.

ADJOURNED ANNUAL TOWN MEETING, Nov. 16, 1891.

*Voted*, That Selectmen maintain four "Public Sign Posts" in this town, to be located as follows, viz.: One near the Town Record building; one near the residence of W. H. Howe; one near the Methodist Church in East Glastonbury; one at the corner near Sheffield's store.

*Voted*, That the present assessment of this town is very unequal and not according to the statute relating to the assessment of taxes, therefore be it

*Resolved*, That the present assessors, with George C. Andrews, be, and they are hereby, directed to assess on the present list all property liable to taxation against the owners thereof, at its present true and market value, as near as can be ascertained, and that they appoint such assistants as they may need.

*Voted, Resolved*, That the following changes and additions be, and they are hereby, made in and to the by-laws of this town, viz.:

SECTION 1. No person shall carry on the business of a dealer in junk, old metals, or second-hand articles, within this town, unless he shall have a license therefor, as provided in section 2998 of the General Statutes; each violation of this section shall be fined not more than fifty dollars.



SEC. 2. No person shall carry on the business of a peddler within the limits of this town, selling at retail any article ordinarily sold by peddlers, unless he shall have a license therefor issued by the selectmen.

Provided this by-law shall not be construed to forbid the peddling of such articles as are usually carried by meat, fish, and berry peddlers, and in bakers' wagons, or of farm produce raised by the peddler. But no license shall be issued for the selling of any article, the sale of which is prohibited by law. Every violation of the provisions of this section shall incur a penalty of four dollars to the town.

SEC. 3. No person shall ride a bicycle upon any sidewalk in this town, except in accordance with the following rules, under a penalty of four dollars (\$4.00) for each offense, payable to the town.

Rule 1. No rider of a bicycle shall meet or pass any person on the sidewalk without sounding a sufficient warning at least 15 rods away, and continuing to repeat the warning until within 20 feet of the person thus met or passed; persons on foot to have the first right of way, the rider to give them ample room, and, if necessary, he shall dismount and roll his machine past the person thus met or passed.

Rule 2. No person shall ride a bicycle upon any sidewalk in this town between sunset of any day and sunrise of the day following without having a red light placed conspicuously on the front of their machine.

The by-laws of this town passed in 1857, forbidding the riding upon the sidewalk, is hereby modified and added to as above.

The fee to be charged for each license issued under the 2d section of the above by-laws shall be left to the discretion of the selectmen.

Every licensed dealer and peddler shall show his license whenever requested to do so by a constable or grand juror of the town, and a refusal to comply with that request shall be punishable by fine of \$2.00, and forfeiture of the license.

It shall be the duty of the constables and grand jurors to enforce these by-laws and prosecute offenders. The foregoing by-laws and rules shall be in force from and after their publication, as provided by statute.

## TO THE TOWN OF GLASTONBURY.

The undersigned, residents and tax-payers of the said town, respectively represent — That the highway leading north from the village of Addison, toward the village of Hillstown, and also the highway leading from the corner east of the house owned by Albert Walker, to the main street, is in many places worked very narrow and is in very bad repair. We, therefore, request that you make the necessary order in the premises so as to have said highways worked on the lines of the survey properly widened and put in good repair, as we believe public convenience and necessity requires, the same to be done without unnecessary delay.

Dated at Glastonbury this 9th day of November, 1891.

The above petition, signed by James M. Griswold and thirty-one others, was referred to the selectmen, with power to act as they deem best.

The committee appointed at the last meeting in regard to the method of working highways, made a verbal report and the same was accepted.

Said committee suggested, and it was

*Voted*, That an advisory board of five be appointed to act with the selectmen, to take full charge of repairs and permanent improvements on the highways, for a period of five years. Any vacancy in said board to be filled by the remaining members.

The following named gentlemen were appointed to serve as said committee, viz.: John E. Tryon, Samuel Hollister, George C. Andrews, Bernard T. Williams, Nelson S. Bailey.

*Voted*, That by way of permanent improvement of our main roads, the selectmen or those appointed by the town to have charge of the roads, be authorized to get plans and estimates to thoroughly investigate the best and most economical methods for macadamizing the roads of this town, and to contract for at least one mile of good macadamized road from the East Hartford line south, to be completed by September 15, 1892.

*Voted*, That the selectmen erect or provide a pound in the northwest section of the town.

## REPORTS OF THE ACTING SCHOOL VISITORS TO THE BOARD.

### Districts Nos. 1 and 5.

District No. 1, *Naubuc*. Miss Mattie L. Brown of Talcottville taught the graded school for the year. Has given general satisfaction.

Miss Helen E. Wadsworth has had the care of the primary department. Good school work has been done here the past year.

District No. 5, *Addison*. This school has been taught the past school year by Miss Mary J. Robinson, and good progress has been made. A good book case has been added to the schoolroom furnitu .

### Districts Nos. 2, 3, and 18.

District No. 2, *Center*. Two schools were maintained for the entire year. Mrs. Geo. R. Hale again taught in room No. 1. The room was well filled, and the attendance was good. The children seemed to take interest in their studies. Miss Jennie Treat of Hockanum taught in the upper room all the year. The latter part of the year the attendance was small. Some of the scholars seemed to make good progress.

District No. 3, *Green*. Miss Mary E. Foster taught during the year. Her ideas and methods of teaching were good, but she lacked the ability to preserve in the school the good order essential to good results. The attendance, especially in the summer term, was small.

District No. 18, *Williams*. This school was taught by Miss Mary Huntley, a teacher of considerable experience. She brought earnestness and thoroughness to her work, though the school was not large.

**Districts Nos. 4, 7, and 10.**

District No. 4, *Old Church*. Miss Isabella K. Hubbard of Cobalt had charge of this school for the year, as she had for the year before. Miss Hubbard's work is worthy of special commendation, and she would have been employed again could her services have been secured. An event for special mention in connection with the school for the year is its "Flag Raising." Miss Lucy P. Carbery of Andover succeeds Miss Hubbard.

District No. 7, *Taylorstown*. Miss Ethel L. Clarke of Portland conducted this school for the first term and did good work. Through severe illness she was obliged to decline a re-engagement. Miss Ida B. Strickland of South Glastonbury had charge of the school for the other two terms. This was Miss Strickland's first charge, but the examinations showed true regard and ability for this important work. There is a good set of maps in this school, but more blackboards might be put to good use. Miss Clarke has again been engaged to conduct the school.

District No. 10, *Nayaug*. The school in this district has been conducted throughout the year by Miss Susie M. Thompson of South Glastonbury, who has now held this position for seven successive terms. The examinations have shown good work. In addition to extensive improvements in the school building reported last year, new school furniture throughout should be mentioned, including a neat case for the library, to which a few new books have been added. The school yard has been enlarged, and a new substantial fence built. Miss Thompson continues in this school.

A word further may be added in reference to these three schools — a condition of things which probably prevails in reference to all parts of the town where there is but a single school in the district. There are, it is to safe say, at least twenty classes, on an average, in each of these schools, daily, and this does not include writing and physiology (in which last, instruction is, as a rule, probably, not given oftener than once a week). Little ones are not heard, as a rule, to read and spell but twice a day. Want of time? So many grades. What an argument is here for graded schools. Even if but two could combine.

**Districts Nos. 6, 8, and 9.**

District No. 6, *South Centre*. This school has been in charge of Mrs. Edward D. Miller of South Glastonbury, who has been the teacher for several years previous, and is engaged for the coming school year, which shows that she is well liked. Mrs. Miller has many thanks for her kindness and perseverance in procuring money and buying a flag for the schoolhouse, which I wish more teachers would imitate and have a flag on their schoolhouse. The number of scholars registered was forty-two. The attendance was good through the year.

District No. 8, *Matson Hill*. This school has been in charge of Miss Alice L. Hollister the whole school year. Miss Hollister is a resident of South Glastonbury. This was Miss Hollister's first effort at teaching, and from what I could learn her work was well done. The number of scholars registered was seventeen, which makes a good showing for this district. The attendance was good.

District No. 9, *Twine Mill*. The school in this district has been in charge of Mr. Charles Walker the whole school year. Mr. Walker is a resident of South Glastonbury. The number of scholars registered was fifty-six; the attendance was very good for the fall and winter terms. In the spring term there were a good many of the scholars sick, consequently the attendance was not as good. I made some enquiry, and the people of the district were well pleased with Mr. Walker's work. This district should have another room added to its building; for the number of scholars in the district is too many to be crowded into one room — for their health, and for the work for the teacher. Hope some steps will be taken in this direction.

**Districts Nos. 12, 13, 14.**

District No. 12, *Wassuc*. The school in this district has been taught the entire school year by Miss Sara T. Brainard, a resident of the district. #### Districts Nos. 11, 15, 16, and 17.

District No. 17, *Neipsic*. Miss Lucy L. Carrier of Glastonbury has again had charge of this school for the entire year. She does hard work and is a thorough teacher. That she gives satisfaction to the district is evidenced by the fact of her engagement for the ensuing year.

All of these districts seem willing and anxious to keep their school buildings in repair, as all have made or have in progress repairs or improvement of school grounds.

### The School of Higher Grade.

An appropriation of \$300 was made by the town to aid in carrying on this school for the year at South Glastonbury. The school visitors in that part of the town, in whose hands it had been placed, secured the services of Miss Jennie A. Pratt of that place, who had successfully taught it the 20 weeks provided for the year before. On consideration of receiving the appropriation, and being allowed to charge each pupil 20 cents per week, the agreement was made to teach the school, provide room, care of same, furniture and fuel, the town and the patrons of the school to be at no further expense. The school has been taught 36 weeks, the time called for by our public schools, and with devotion and success.

Thirty-three different pupils have attended, representing seven or eight different districts of the town, the enrollment for the first term being 31, for the second 32, and for the third 12, making the average for the three terms, 25. In addition to the branches usually taught in our common schools, there have been taught Algebra, Latin, and Book-keeping. This school does much to meet an important need of the older and more advanced pupils in this part of the town, and helps to give the advantages of the Graded and High School. May the time soon come when there may be a building suitable not only for the school, but which may contain other rooms for public use, and so desirably located and so well arranged and provided for, as to be a pride and pleasure and rich blessing in all the coming years.

## REPORT OF THE SECRETARY OF THE BOARD OF SCHOOL VISITORS.

*The first meeting* of the Board was the annual meeting held Oct. 31, 1891. There were present W. H. Griswold, Rev. Marcus Burr, A. A. Babcock, Julius S. Hollister, W. I. Goodale, and S. H. Williams.

The Board organized by electing W. H. Griswold chairman, and S. H. Williams secretary. It was voted to adopt the same rules to govern the School Visitors as were adopted the year before.

It was voted that Rev. M. Burr and A. A. Babcock be a committee from this Board to oversee the school of higher grade at So. Glastonbury for the year.

The enumeration of scholars between 4 and 16 years of age in the town was then considered — and the result will be found in the table of statistics.

*The second meeting* was held with the Selectmen as a Joint Board, as per statute June 14, 1892.

There were present, P. H. Goodrich and Charles Bell, Selectmen, and W. H. Griswold, Rev. M. Burr, A. A. Babcock, S. H. Williams, School Visitors.

P. H. Goodrich was chosen chairman, and S. H. Williams clerk.

The same appropriations for the 18 districts were recommended as last year, amounting to \$5,700.

It was also voted to recommend the appropriation of \$300 for the school of higher grade in So. Glastonbury, and of \$200 for the Glastonbury Free Academy for the ensuing year. The meeting then adjourned.

In connection with this report, there is printed for the first time a list of the scholars of the town with their age and the number of days each attended school each term during the last year. This is in accordance with the vote of the town at its last meeting. Its effectiveness cannot be determined until another year shall have

passed. It has not been easy to make a correct list in all respects, and it is not impossible that there may be a number of errors. Imperfectly kept school registers, carelessly prepared enumeration, and the moving about from one district to another, all add confusion and difficulty to such a task.

In regard to two schools of higher grade, which the town has helped to support for the last year, the report of the committee of the Board to oversee the school in So. Glastonbury will be found on page 7. The following report shows in a few words the attendance and work at the Academy:

“The Academy has had this year three terms, a total of 38 weeks. The entire number of pupils enrolled has been 70.

“The daily average in the fall was 90 per cent. of members attending, in the winter, 85 per cent. This shows a much more regular attendance than has often been the case in the district schools, where the record has frequently been below 75 per cent. and sometimes as low as 50 per cent.

“The standard for admission to the Academy was made a little higher at the opening of Fall Term of 1891. The Trustees adopted regular courses of study, along the lines of which the pupils are successfully working. And the work done during the year '91-'92 has been an advance in grade upon the work of the opening terms of the former year. Almost one-half of the entire number of pupils enrolled have entered the classical course, the remainder giving their attention to higher English.

“It is important that thorough and efficient preparatory work be done in the district schools, in order that pupils may be able to obtain the most advantage from the Academy.”

The scholars under 16 years of age who attended these schools are designated in the list of scholars at the close of this report. The summary of the attendance is as follows:
