## TOWN MEETINGS HELD.

Adjourned Annual Town Meeting, October 18, 1897.

Voted, That the report of the Selectmen be accepted and placed on file.

Voted, That the report of the Town Treasurer be accepted and placed on file.

Voted, That the report of the Treasurer of the Town Deposit, Town, and School Funds be accepted and placed on file.

Voted, That the report of the Health Officer be accepted and placed on file.

Voted, That a tax of 15 mills on the dollar be laid on list to be made out on list of 1897, to be perfected, and the same is hereby levied to be due and payable April 1, 1898, to defray the running expenses of the town, and use a portion towards paying the town debt.

Voted, That the Selectmen be authorized to work, or cause to be worked and kept in repair, all first-class roads, and such parts of second-class roads as they deem necessary. The balance of second-class roads and all third-class roads to be let for three (3) years to be worked by contract and kept in repair subject to the inspection and satisfaction of the Selectmen.

Voted, That the Selectmen be, and they are, hereby instructed to quit-claim all the interest of this town in and to the Cemetery, and its appurtenances, known as the "Center," or "Old Church" Cemetery, to the Old Church Cemetery Association, recently organized under the laws of this State.

Voted, Whenever a Cemetery Association shall be organized for the care and maintenance of any cemetery in Glastonbury, the selectmen, upon the request of such associations, may transfer to them all the title and interest of the town in and to such cemetery and its appurtenances.

Voted, That the report of the Secretary of the Board of School Visitors be accepted and placed on file.

Voted, That \$6,980 be appropriated for school purposes for the schools in town for the ensuing year, as follows:

Voted, Resolved, That a committee of five be appointed to consider the question of "Town Management of Schools"; that this committee serve without pay for their services, and that after a careful consideration of the whole matter, they make a written report to the town not later than September 15, 1898, said report to be printed in the "Glastonbury Bulletin" and "East Hartford Gazette."

The following committee was appointed: Samuel H. Williams, J. Herbert Hutchins, George F. Waters, John W. Purtill, Hartwell N. Brainard.

Voted, That the sum of \$50.00 be and the same is hereby appropriated to the committee having the charge of Memorial Day.

Voted, That a committee of five be appointed to investigate and report a plan for bonding the town for the amount of \$100,000.00 and report at an adjourned Town Meeting to be held December 14, 1897, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon.

The following committee was chosen: Frank D. Glazier, Samuel H. Williams, Hector Chapman, Oliver R. Morgan, John W. Purtill.

Voted, That hereafter the Collector receive as salary a sum not exceeding three hundred dollars.

Voted, That the Treasurer be authorized to borrow on the faith and credit of the town a sum not exceeding \$15,000.00 to be used for the running expenses of the town.

At the Adjourned Annual Town Meeting, held December 14, 1897, to hear the report of the committee appointed at the meeting of October 18, as regards bonding the town, it was found that the call for said meeting was not legal.

The following vote was passed:

Voted, That the Selectmen be and they are hereby instructed to call a Special Town Meeting as soon as they deem expedient for the purpose of immediately taking such action in regard to issuing bonds to cover the indebtedness of the town as they may deem best.

### SPECIAL TOWN MEETING.

December 24, 1897.

The following preamble and votes were passed:

WHEREAS, The Town of Glastonbury has incurred debts to the amount of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000), and is indebted to various persons and corporations for that sum, therefore,

Voted, That the Treasurer and Selectmen are hereby authorized and directed for and on behalf of this town, to issue and sell its bonds to the amount of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000), to be denominated "Glastonbury Town Bonds," each bond to be for not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000), and payable as follows:

Fifteen thousand dollars, five years from January 1, 1898.

Fifteen thousand dollars, ten years from January 1, 1898.

Fifteen thousand dollars, fifteen years from January 1, 1898.

Fifteen thousand dollars, twenty years from January 1, 1898.

Forty thousand dollars, thirty years from January 1, 1898.

Said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of four per centum (4%) per annum, payable semi-annually on the first days of January and July in each year, and shall be signed by the Treasurer and Selectmen of the town. The proceeds of said bonds shall be used to pay the present indebtedness of the town, and if anything remains after the payment of said indebtedness it shall be used for such town purposes as are authorized by law.

Voted, That to provide for the payment of the bonds of the town this day authorized, as they become due, a Sinking Fund shall be established, and for this purpose the sum of three thousand dollars (\$3,000) shall annually, on or before the first day of May in each year, be set apart out of the funds of the town, and credited to said fund by the Town Treasurer. Said sum of three thousand dollars shall be provided for in the annual tax levy and raised by taxation in the same manner as the ordinary expenses of the town are raised.

The Treasurer is hereby instructed to loan the moneys belonging to said Sinking Fund to some Security Company, Trust Company, or Bank, incorporated by the laws of this State and of approved standing, to be selected by the Town Treasurer and Selectmen, and said Treasurer is also instructed to hold possession of said Sinking Fund and the increase thereof, and the securities in which it may be invested, and apply said fund and said increase to the payment of said bonds as they severally become due.

#### SPECIAL TOWN MEETING.

January 19, 1898.

Voted, That we hereby ratify and confirm the votes passed at the Town Meeting held December 24, 1897, regarding bonding the town and the creating of a Sinking Fund, believing it to be for the best interest of the town.

#### ANNUAL REPORT OF HEALTH OFFICER.

There have been reported sixteen cases of measles, occurring during the months of March, July and August. The origin was not known in any case. All were of mild type.

Four cases of scarlet fever occurred in one household. The first case was a boarder from Hartford, who was taken sick almost immediately on his arrival in town. No doctor was called until he was taken to his home and then no warning was given to prevent the spread of the disease here. Three members of the family took the disease here and were seriously sick.

There were two cases of typhoid fever reported. In one case the disease was undoubtedly contracted away from home; in the other the origin could not be ascertained.

Whooping cough has been almost continually present, but no cases have been reported officially. Indeed, in most cases no doctor is called.

In all cases of contagious diseases reported the usual methods of isolation and disinfection have been taken to prevent the spread of the disease.

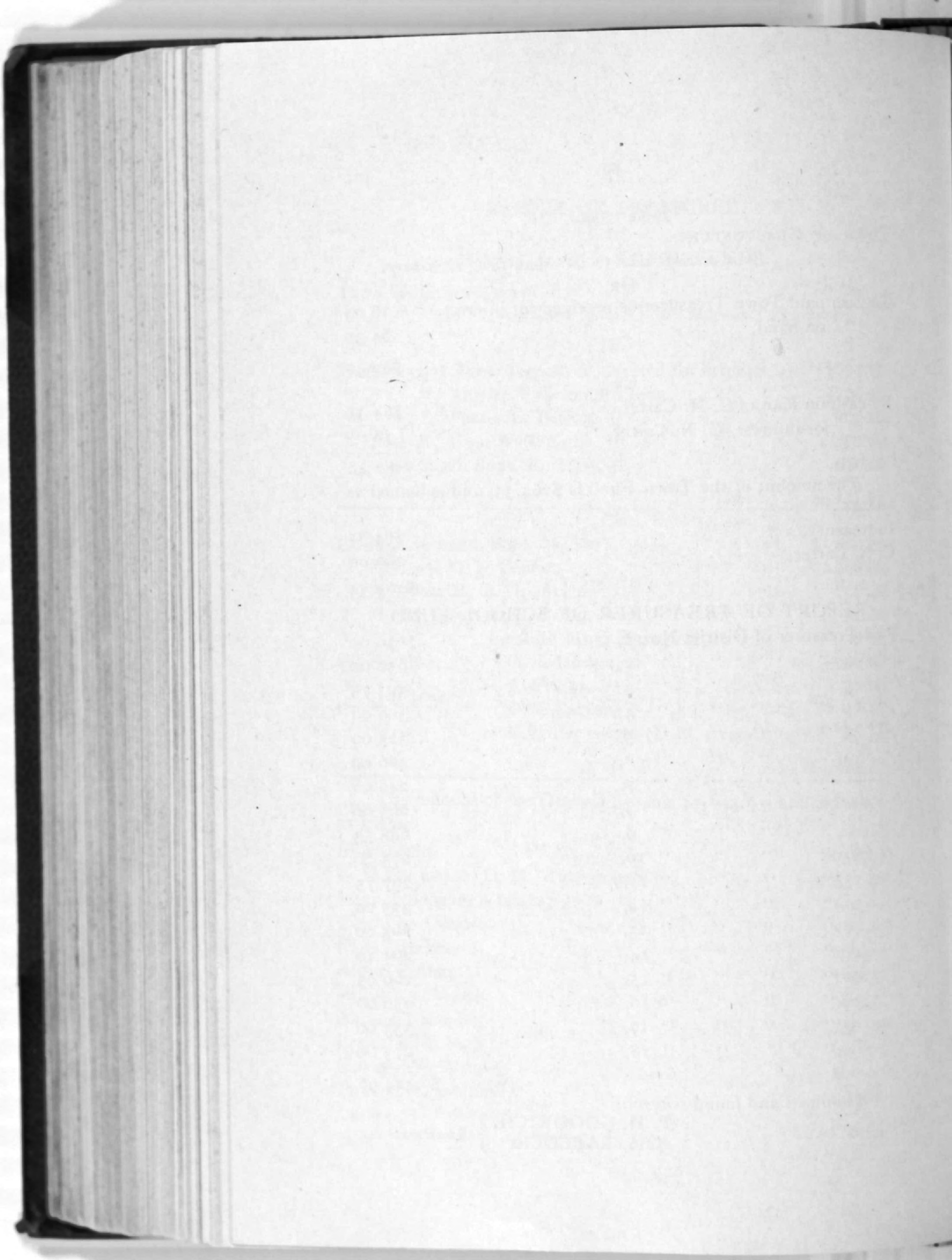

## REPORTS OF ACTING SCHOOL VISITORS.

---

### Districts Nos. 1 and 5.

Having been appointed during the summer to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Mr. W. H. Griswold, I feel that I labor under a disadvantage in making a report of these schools.

District No. 1, Naubuc. The higher grade was taught by Mrs. H. P. Miller and the lower by Mrs. V. E. P. Hale. Both are teachers of long experience and did excellent work.

District No. 5, Addison. Miss Lottie Spafard taught the entire year with good results.

### Districts Nos. 1, 2, 3, 5 and 18.

District No. 1. Until near the close of the year this district was under the care of Mr. Griswold. Mrs. Hale, the teacher in the primary department, and Mrs. Miller, in the upper grade, are both teachers whose work is well known in town. They are faithful workers. The schoolhouse in this district is far too small for its needs. In the primary department sixty pupils are crowded into a room adapted to accommodate thirty or thirty-five. Something should be done immediately to provide more room for the pupils here. Neither pupils nor teachers can do the best possible under the present disadvantageous condition. This overcrowding is also harmful to the health of the children.

District No. 5. This district was also under Mr. Griswold's supervision until his death. Miss Spafard did very efficient work as teacher here, satisfactory to parents and helpful to pupils. In this district also there is need of better accommodations for pupils. The seating capacity of the schoolroom is insufficient for the number of pupils in attendance. It is not wise to have our schools lacking in anything that will enhance the comfort and advantage of the pupils.

District No. 2. Both Miss Cuzner and Miss Taylor, who taught in the two rooms in this school, are teachers of experience. The classification of pupils in their work is as good as can be under our present system. The work of Miss Taylor with the small children has been very nicely done. A few little improvements, like putting blackboards in proper condition for use, repairing desks, etc., would be very desirable here. Schoolhouses and all their appurtenances should be kept in perfect condition in order to teach the children lessons of order and thrift. A neglected schoolhouse will engender a spirit of slovenliness in the children.

District No. 3. Miss Adele Hollister, who had taught elsewhere in town the previous year, taught in this district through the year. The work done here

was good, though it seemed to lack somewhat of the spirit of enthusiasm. Some provision should be made for a water supply for the pupils attending this school. The present plan of having the children visit the neighboring houses for water is an inconvenience to both the children and the householders.

District No. 18. Miss Bessie Brainard has completed two successful years in this school. Her work is worthy of praise. She possesses the very valuable faculty of keeping her pupils attentive, diligent and interested. The result is, of course, manifest day by day as the work goes on, and in the progress made. It would be very advantageous if we had some system by which a teacher who is proving herself to be in the right place and doing good work could be retained in her position by a little advance in salary if necessary.

#### Districts Nos. 4, 8 and 10.

District No. 4, Old Church. Taught by Miss Alice M. House during the entire year, who is also engaged for the coming year. Miss House is taking her place as a teacher of worth among our corps of instructors. This schoolroom is well supplied with appliances for instruction, especially as regards books for supplementary reading.

Irregularity of attendance by the children of a few families in this district is the greatest drawback to be noted.

Many parents fail to realize the importance of regular attendance of their children in school and their duty in this matter.

One entered the Academy.

District No. 8, Matson Hill. Miss Dorothy Cone, a graduate of New Haven High School, taught the fall term with excellent success.

The winter and spring terms were taught by Mr. Charles Shipman—his first experience in teaching. He has proved himself to be a good instructor and an excellent disciplinarian.

No better average attendance can be found throughout the town than during the winter term, when thirteen pupils were registered and the average was 12.07.

Something should be done immediately about the schoolhouse. If there is a prospect soon of consolidation the old one might be repaired and made more comfortable, if not a new one *should be built* during this fall.

Mr. Shipman is re-engaged.

District No. 10, Nayaug. The teacher for the fall and winter terms was Miss Mabel B. Clark. This was her first school. She did good work and proved her ability as an instructor, but owing to ill health was obliged to give up the school at the end of the tenth week of the winter term.

Miss Eva McLean finished the year's work in this district with good satisfaction.

Mrs. H. P. Miller is engaged for the ensuing year.

Two pupils entered the Academy.

### Districts Nos. 6, 7 and 9.

District No. 6, South Center. This school has been taught the whole school year by Mrs. Mary M. Goodrich, as principal, and Miss Mary L. Shipman, as assistant. Mrs. Goodrich has taught this school for the past four years and is engaged to teach the ensuing year.

This was Miss Shipman's first year in our schools and she has won a place worthy of honorable mention. Number of scholars registered was 64. The attendance has been very good. This district has: Books of reference, 3; volumes in library, 21; maps, 5. An appropriation of five dollars from the State and a like amount raised in the district has permitted the addition of several volumes to the library.

Four pupils entered the Academy from this district.

District No. 7, Taylortown. Miss Amy M. Griswold has taught the school of this district through the entire school year and is engaged for the ensuing year. Number of scholars registered, 11. Books of reference, 4; volumes in library, 37; maps, 8.

Three pupils entered the Academy.

District No. 9, Twine Mill. The two schools in this district have registered 68. Miss Catherine E. Walker has taught in Room No. 1 the whole of the school year. She took up and conducted the work in it with the same ability that she formerly conducted the school in Room No. 2. Miss Sarah J. Brainard has taught in Room No. 2 the whole of the school year. Miss Walker and Miss Brainard are engaged for the coming year. Miss Brainard has kept her school in good order. Her pupils have made good progress in reading, spelling and arithmetic. Some of them are very enthusiastic in their work. Books of reference, 3; volumes in library, 57; maps, 9. The schoolhouse has been put in first-class order under the present district committee.

Three pupils entered the Academy.

### Districts No. 11, 14, 15 and 16.

District No. 11. This school was taught during the fall term by Miss Ida M. Barrows of Mendon, Mass. Miss Barrows's work with the younger children was very successful, but she did not care to continue longer than the fall term, and the winter and spring terms were taught by Mrs. E. C. Goodale, with the school in charge of Acting School Visitor, Rev. F. A. Spear. The school buildings are in good condition, and there were nineteen scholars when all were present.

District No. 14. Mrs. Grace A. Strickland of Buckingham was in charge of this school during the entire year and her work was considered by your committee highly satisfactory. A change of District Committee, however, has resulted in a change of teacher the present year, and Miss Nellie Cowperthwaite of Hyde Park, Mass., is in charge of the school at this writing. The buildings are in good condition.

District No. 15. Mr. Roland Burr held the position of teacher during the year. Mr. Burr was perhaps more successful with some branches of study than with others, still, on the whole, we considered it a good school; the scholars were interested in their work, especially with mathematics and with reading, and the discipline was commendable.

Miss Minnie V. Fryer of South Manchester is engaged to teach the present year.

The school buildings are in good condition.

District No. 16, Goslee Street. This school was taught during the fall term by Miss Mabel Allen of Matfield, Mass. This was Miss Allen's first attempt at teaching, and, while her work was fairly satisfactory, she did not care to continue, with an opportunity offered nearer her home. She was followed during the remainder of the year by Miss Minnie Fryer of South Manchester, also a beginner, but one of whom we expect good results in school work.

Mrs. Mary C. Treat of Buckingham is in charge of the school at present, and we consider the district fortunate in securing the services of such an experienced teacher.

The schoolhouse is in fair condition.

**SUMMARY.** While some of our would-be agitators are clamoring for something different—some for consolidation, some for less schools, and some for one-man power in management—we are not by any means discouraged by the outlook for the schools of our town.

All children never are and never will be able to reach the top round of the ladder; it is an impossibility.

Please compare the recent examinations of candidates for entrance to the Glastonbury Academy with the work of applicants for entrance to the East Hartford High School. You will find that a larger percentage of the Glastonbury children were able to fill the requirements. Our schools are far more scattered than the schools of East Hartford; and many of them with less scholars, but we contend that the largest school is not by any means at all times the most successful, if ever. These districts (11, 14, 15 and 16) are continually sending scholars to higher schools, both to the Glastonbury Academy and to the South Manchester High School, also to business colleges.

We consider the efforts of the State Board of Education to enforce the regular attendance of pupils of this town a complete farce; even when complaints are made to them, their work is all talk and printed matter, and no examples made of delinquents. If the parents would insist on a more regular attendance of their children they would be far better satisfied with results.

### Districts Nos. 12, 13 and 17.

District No. 12, Wassuc. Miss Amy B. Walker, of South Coventry taught this school through the fall term with considerable success. Miss Harriet F. Black of Hartford, a Normal graduate, taught through the winter and spring terms. Miss Black belongs in the first rank among teachers, doing excellent work in every branch. She is wanting at no point. We are gratified to learn that better offers did not tempt her away. She is teaching now in District No. 17. District No. 12 furnished one scholar for the Academy examination and she passed with honorable mention. The school is on the up grade. Miss Bessie B. Brainard is engaged for the present year.

District No. 13, Middle District. This school, although one of our smallest, is paying in good returns. Mr. Mason I. Loveland taught a praiseworthy school through the fall and winter terms. He was succeeded in the spring by Miss Mabel F. Thomas, who came to us with four years of experience in higher grades and with the best of recommendations. A term of eight weeks would not suffice to show all that she is capable of, but thus far expectations have been fully met. She is re-engaged for the present term. The school is unfortunate in having no school yard and no well. In other respects it is quite well equipped.

District No. 17, Nipsic. This is one of our best school buildings, being modern, roomy, well lighted and ventilated. Miss Daisy B. Sutcliffe taught an excellent school during the fall and winter terms. The spring term was somewhat interrupted by her illness and failing health, but she continued to the end of the term. Miss Black, the former teacher of District No. 12, is engaged for the present year.

Experience in school supervision has not been without its lessons. My conviction is that (1.) There should be greater uniformity in the management of our town schools; (2.) There should be a stricter regard for school laws and regulations; (3.) All applicants for schools, unless they have taught consecutively with satisfaction, should be required to pass a fair examination.

In regard to the standard of scholarship maintained it is my conviction, after careful observation, that the fault lies not altogether with incompetent teachers, but more with the inexcusable attitude of many parents respecting school attendance and government. When the parent tells the child that he need not do what the teacher requires, or that he need not go to school unless he wants to, the teacher is not to blame for the little the child knows.

Personally, I am in favor of all the schools being placed under the supervision of one competent person, believing that this would remedy many of the defects.

## REPORT OF THE SECRETARY.

---

The Board of Visitors met for organization October 9, 1897, all members present except Mr. W. H. Griswold.

### FIRST MEETING.

A. A. Babcock, Esq., was elected chairman and Mrs. Julia T. Clark, secretary.

Meeting of Joint Board of School Visitors and Selectmen was then called.

Voted, To fix the estimates for each district appropriation, which were the same as the estimates made in June, except Districts 10, 11 and 14, which received \$10 additional.

Voted, To hold Teachers' Meeting the fourth Monday of each term.

Voted, That the several members of the Board be Acting Visitors in their several sections.

### SECOND MEETING.

Met October 30, 1897—5 present—to perfect the enumeration of children. The report from one district not being ready, adjourned to November 20. Change of text books was considered.

### THIRD MEETING.

Met November 20, 1897—all present—and perfected the enumeration. Whole number, seven hundred and ninety, showing a gain of fourteen from last year. Number not in school, eighty-two.

Voted, A change in text books—arithmetic and history. Books adopted, Milne's Arithmetic and Montgomery's History.

Voted, That pupils be required to study history as soon as, in the judgment of the teacher, they are ready for it.

### FOURTH MEETING.

Met December 18, 1897—5 present. Mr. Babcock appointed to attend to the introduction of the new text books.

Committee appointed for the Teachers' Meeting of winter term, viz.: Rev. F. H. Spear, Mrs. Julia T. Clark.

Different studies were assigned each member of the Board to prepare questions for examination of teachers.

### FIFTH MEETING.

Met December 24, 1897—5 present. Examination papers approved by the Board.

## SIXTH MEETING.

Met April 9, 1898—6 present.

Voted, To retain the same committee as last term for the coming Teachers' Meeting.

Voted, That the topics for the morning session be *assigned* to the teachers.

## SEVENTH MEETING.

Met June 21, 1898, as a Joint Board with the Selectmen—5 Acting School Visitors present and 3 Selectmen.

A deficiency in the funds of the Sixth District was voted—amount, \$16. The other deficiencies were caused by the failure of the Secretary to inform the Town Treasurer of the advance made to four districts.

Estimates were then made for the sum necessary for each district. (See table of statistics.)

Joint Board adjourned. A meeting of the Board of School Visitors was then held.

Voted, To fill the vacancy caused by the death of Mr. William H. Griswold. Vote by ballot resulted in the election of Mr. C. E. Andrews.

Voted, That the schools open August 29.

Voted, To hold a meeting for examination of teachers August 22.

## EIGHTH MEETING.

Met June 27, 1898—4 present.

Voted, To consider the change of text book (Reader) at the time of teachers' examination, August 22.

## NINTH MEETING.

Met July 30, 1898—3 present.

Voted, That the matter of continuing the school in the Sixteenth District be left to the judgment of Mr. W. I. Goodale and Rev. F. H. Spear.

Officers of the Eighth District appointed as follows: Fred Chapman, committee and treasurer; Wilbur J. Hodge, clerk; Fred G. Patten, collector.

## TENTH MEETING.

Met August 22, 1898—4 present—for examination of teachers and granting certificates.

Fred G. Patten was appointed committee of the Eighth District in place of Fred Chapman.

## ELEVENTH MEETING.

Met September 10, 1898. All members present except Mr. Hutchins, who was out of the State.

It was decided at this meeting to adopt the Baldwin series of Readers through the fourth year, and "Williams's Choice Literature," beginning with Book 2, Intermediate. Mr. Babcock was appointed to make the change.

Mr. C. E. Andrews and Rev. F. H. Spear were appointed a committee for the Teachers' Meeting, October 3, 1898.



## ACADEMY.

The number of students attending the Academy is still on the increase.

During the past year ninety-five (95) different pupils were registered. This fall term opens with one hundred and two (102). The entering class numbers thirty-three (33), with the average age of thirteen years and six months.

The graduating class of June, '98, numbered only two (2), viz.: B. Fred Grant and William S. Brainard. There are eight members of Class '99.

The two prizes offered by Dr. C. G. Rankin for general excellence in scholarship throughout the year, were awarded as follows: First, a gold medal to Alice I. Manning, of the Addison District; second, a silver medal to Nellie McLaughlin, of the South Center District.

Teachers: Principal, S. Archibald Smith, Glastonbury. Assistants, Miss Imogene Bacon, South Glastonbury; Clarence B. Treat, Hockanum.

## TEACHERS' MEETINGS.

Three Teachers' Meetings have been held during the year, which have been both interesting and instructive. The teachers of the public schools and Academy have readily responded with papers on the topics assigned by the program committee. A more general interest by the townspeople in these meetings would add materially to the good work that is being done in this form of school work.
