Another piece of correspondence was from Greg Mahoney regarding the Fairfield Village Community Sewer System Maintenance and Replacement agreement. Greg monitors the accounts and sees whether monies are being deposited or not. The ownership of the association was transferred and at that point money began being deposited into the incorrect account; this has since been corrected, and they are back on track.

Mr. Davis MOVED to adjourn the meeting.

Mr. Carlson SECONDED the MOTION and it was unanimously APPROVED.
