<u>Criminal History Record Information Search - \$75.00 (Form DPS-846-C)</u>. A request submitted for any individual in which a full criminal history record response is being sought. A full criminal history record response will be provided, if applicable.

<u>Fingerprint Supported Search - \$75.00</u>. Criminal history record information will be searched by the subject's fingerprints. A full set of fingerprints must be submitted with the request. A full criminal history record will be provided, if applicable.
