Time is running out to review your Medicare coverage plans. Be sure to read all notices sent to you by your insurer (s) as there may be changes in your plan(s) that may affect your coverage and costs in 2020. Additionally, during Open Enrollment you can: join or change a Part D Plan (prescription drug coverage); return to original Medicare from a Medicare Advantage Plan; or enroll in or change Medicare Advantage plans. Access Health:

Access Health CT Open Enrollment continues through December 15, 2019. Access Health CT is Connecticut's health insurance marketplace; a one stop "shop" with health insurance coverage options for individuals, families and small employers. *Current Medicare beneficiaries already have coverage and do not need to do anything related to Access Health CT.* (See note on Medicare Open Enrollment.)

For those needing health insurance, the best way to see if you qualify for financial assistance in obtaining health insurance, to compare plans or complete a single application for any of the plans offered by Access Health CT plans is on the web at <http://www.accesshealthct.com>. Energy Assistance

Glastonbury Social Services continues taking applications for heating assistance. Help with heating costs is available through the Connecticut Energy Assistance Program for qualified renters and homeowners who heat with deliverables (oil, propane, wood) or utilities (gas or electric). The income limit for an individual is \$3,014 per month, for a couple the income limit is \$3,941 per month. Homeowners have a liquid asset limit of \$15,000 and renters \$12,000, but any assets over those limits may be added to your annual income to see if you still qualify financially. Food Share

The Foodshare truck will be at First Church of Christ, 2183 Main Street, Glastonbury from 10:15 to 10:45 on December 4 and December 18. Mobile Foodshare is an outdoor food distribution for persons of low income. The food choices vary from week to week but usually include bread and several types of fresh produce. Other items may also be offered depending on availability. Please remember to bring a bag or box with you to carry your food.
