We have done a nice job building sidewalks in the center of town up Main Street. I see citizens walking there safely all the time. Now we need to extend that luxury to other residents in town, particularly on New London Turnpike and Chestnut Hill Road connecting to the Main Street sidewalks. There should be one contiguous sidewalk all the way up New London to Country Club Road. This project could be done over 2-3 phases. This is a pathway that includes the high school, which is a community center, and should be walkable and joggable for our kids and citizens for several miles. I see many people walking up that dangerous hill on the road where there are start and stop sidewalks, particularly up where there is a blind sharp turn at Kinne and Russet.
