Information about the new COVID-19 boosters

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has approved booster shots for **Moderna** and **Johnson & Johnson** vaccines. **Pfizer** boosters have already been approved.

When will Hartford HealthCare offer the new boosters?

To ensure the highest levels of safety, and to provide time to put all needed processes in place, **Hartford HealthCare expects to begin offering Moderna and Johnson & Johnson boosters Wednesday, October 27, 2021.**

Are you eligible for a booster?

If you got two doses of Moderna vaccine [NEW]

OR: If you got two doses of Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine [PREVIOUSLY ANNOUNCED]

- If you are 65 or older
- Or: If you are 18 or older and one or more of the following apply:
 - o Are in [a long-term care facility](#) (such as a nursing home)
 - o Have certain [underlying medical conditions](#) (such as cancer)
 - o Work in [a high-risk environment](#) (such as a hospital or grocery store)
- And it has been **at least six months** since you received your second dose of Moderna vaccine

... You are eligible for a booster dose of any of the following COVID-19 vaccines:

- o Moderna
- o Pfizer
- o Johnson & Johnson

If you got a single shot of the Johnson & Johnson vaccine [NEW]

- And it has been **at least two months** since you received your dose of J&J vaccine

... You are eligible for a booster dose of any of the following COVID-19 vaccines:

- o Moderna
- o Pfizer
- o Johnson & Johnson

How to get your vaccine or booster with Hartford HealthCare

- o As a safety measure, Hartford HealthCare currently offers Pfizer boosters only to people who have previously had two doses of Pfizer
- o Starting Wednesday, October 27, Hartford HealthCare will offer Moderna and J&J boosters, along with Pfizer
