TOWN SEEKING MEMBERS FOR ARCHITECTURAL SITE DESIGN REVIEW COMMITTEE (ASDRC)

The Town Council recently amended the Building Zone Regulations to establish the Town Center Village District Overlay Zone (TCVD). The new Zone is intended to help

guide development within the general Town Center area. As part of the TCVD regulation, development proposals will be reviewed by the soon to be established Architectural Site Design Review Committee (ASDRC). Per state statute and the regulation, members of the ASDRC shall include at least 2 architects, one landscape architect, and one professional planner/ urban designer. Other members shall have background experience and education in art, historic preservation, or similar areas specifically related to the role of the Committee. A copy of the TCVD regulation is **available on the Town website**, which further outlines the TCVD and ASDRC responsibilities.

IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING HOMEOWNERS' TAX RELIEF PROGRAM

The Homeowners' Tax Relief program is available to Glastonbury homeowners who turned 65 years of age prior to December 31, 2021 and whose 2021 income was \$60,520 or less. New applicants must submit an application and proof of income by the filing deadline of May 13, 2022. The application and detailed instructions will be available on the Town website by February 10, 2022 at www.glastonburyct.gov/taxrelief.

Re-applicants who are required to reapply for the program during the February 1, 2022 - May 13, 2022 filing period will receive a mailing in mid-February.

REMINDER TO CLEAR SNOW

With the winter weather season upon us, property owners are reminded of their obligation to clear snow from the sidewalks on their property. While no such regulations govern the clearing of fire hydrants, the Glastonbury Fire Department asks that residents please do their part in clearing snow from these vital areas in a timely manner following storm events. In a fire response, the time required to clear snow can mean the difference between crucial seconds or minutes needed to save a structure and its inhabitants. When clearing snow this winter, please also keep in mind that Fire Fighters need access to roughly 1 foot of space below the hydrant valve, and another 2 feet of space all around a fire hydrant. A few minutes of work may prove vital to the safety of you or your neighbors! Please do your part to keep our community safe and thank you for your support.
