Section II- Guideline

- The Glastonbury Fire Department has been recognized by the State of Connecticut Department of Public Health as a Supplemental First Responder to the Emergency Medical Responder level (EMR).
- Only those personnel medically certified are to provide patient care.
- Any member of the Glastonbury Fire Department holding a higher medical certification, i.e., EMT or Paramedic, <u>CANNOT</u> operate outside the guidelines of what has been established for EMR.
- The Glastonbury Fire Department is supplement to the Glastonbury Police Department. The Glastonbury Police Department maintains the designation as First Responder for the Town of Glastonbury.

- It shall be the duty of any Fire Department personnel providing medical care to coordinate efforts with the Glastonbury Police Department in regards to patient care until a higher level of Emergency Medical Service arrives on scene.
- The following chart is to be used as a guide to the level of patient care that can be given by those that are medically certified. Note that the guide is NOT an all-inclusive list:

Oral Airway

BVM

Airway & Breathing Minimum Psychomotor Skill Set:

Sellick's Maneuver
Head-tilt chin lift

Jaw thrust
Modified chin lift
Obstruction – manual
Oxygen therapy
Nasal cannula

Non-rebreather face mask Upper airway suctioning
