Section II - Guideline

The Incident Command will implement the Tag Accountability System as defined in this guideline.

GUIDELINE

Implementation of the Tag System for accountability purposes occurs at any Level I situation.

Pirst Alarm responders will leave their "accurate" tag systems with the Incident Commander.

The Incident Commander; once additional resources (beyond Level II) are summoned, will switch accountability from the tactical worksheet to the Tag System.

The following basic rules must be followed for the accountability system to function properly.

- 1. Host and personal never enter the hazard zone
- 2. Tag Systems must be maintained at the Command Post during large or complex incidents

- Tag Systems must only reflect those personnel assigned to the unit designated on tag Crews, other than first alarm assignment, must turn in their Tag System upon arrival at scene to the 4. Command Post
- 5. Crews must retrieve their Tag Systems once dismissed from the scene.
