SUBJECT: APPARATUS OPERATION QUALIFICATIONS - NEW DRIVERS

Section I - Introduction

A. Objective

Being the driver of an emergency vehicle places great responsibility on the shoulders of a fire department driver/operator. Vehicle size, handling, configuration and special conditions under which the vehicle is operated must be considered by the driver or potential driver. If an apparatus driver does not obey all laws and department SOG's, the apparatus and crew may not arrive at a scene safely.

B. Applicability

The operation of any emergency vehicle carries with it an enormous responsibility on the part of the driver, not only to the crew traveling in the vehicle but to the general public, to the drivers of other emergency vehicles responding to an incident, and a responsibility to protect costly equipment and lives. This guideline will be strengthened through training, standard operating guidelines, review of operator's license records and strict enforcement of departmental guidelines and state laws by all department members.

Section II - Guidelines

I. SELECTION

Any active member, who is at least 19 years of age, who a valid State of Connecticut Operators License, and has been recommended by their Company Captain may become eligible for driver/operator training. Company Captains shall consider the members reading, writing and math skills as well as physical fitness, skills and abilities before submitting their recommendations to the Chief's office.

The Chief of the Glastonbury Fire Department or his/her designee shall review the letter of recommendation submitted by the Company Captain and may contact the officers of the members assigned company for further information and discussion.

A copy of the member's operator license history shall be requested and reviewed from the Department of Motor Vehicles. Only with approval from the Chief's office, shall any member be considered for training as a driver/operator.

II. DRIVER'S LICENSING

All Glastonbury Fire Department Driver/Operators are required to hold a current and valid driver's license.

The license shall be of the required type, for the apparatus, which the member is qualified to operate. The department vehicles is excess of 26,001 lbs, shall require the member obtain a 2Q, Class A or B license, with the proper endorsements, before being allowed to be a driver/operator.

It is the responsibility of every Glastonbury Fire Department member to promptly notify the Fire Chief of any changes in the license status (i.e. license type changes, loss of license, etc.). Failure to report a license status change or driving any town-owned vehicle without a valid operator's license may result in disciplinary action.

III. APPARATUS TRAINING

Members training on departmental apparatus shall review, practice and demonstrate the knowledge and skills that were developed during the 2Q or Class B training. This training shall be documented by the amount of training time, skills taught and/or reviewed and apparatus trained with. Additionally, all driver/operators time shall be logged into Firehouse, the departments system of record, anytime they operate apparatus. Once members have completed the training at the company level, including those skills listed Appendix B, a written notification shall be sent to the chief's office advising that, a member is prepared to be examined as a driver/operator.

Upon successful completion, the driver/operator shall only operate the type of apparatus that they are qualified for. In the event that a member fails the examination, the member will be advised of the areas in which their skills were deficient and will be given 30 days to practice before a second examination is scheduled.

Members that have been qualified to operate apparatus prior to October 10, 2007 shall be grandfathered from this training segment unless training involves a newly acquired apparatus or any Company Captain feels that a member needs to be re-evaluated on any apparatus that is within their respected company. Re-evaluation may also occur when records indicate that a member has not driven and/or operated a particular piece of apparatus within a reasonable time period or having undergone some medical treatment.

All driver/operators shall attend emergency vehicle operations training that will be provided at least every 18 months.
