# 2022 PROPERTY REVALUATION - GLASTONBURY

The Town of Glastonbury has contracted with Vision Government Solutions Inc. to perform the property revaluation for the 2022 Grand List. Vision will be working with the Assessor's Office to make this 14-month project a successful one. State law requires towns to revalue every five years, and Glastonbury's last revaluation was completed in 2017. A revaluation will determine the current fair market value of every property in town. It equalizes the values of all properties for the purpose of a fair distribution of the tax burden.

The major phases of a municipal revaluation are: Data & Photo Collection, Market Analysis, Valuation, Field Review and Informal Hearings. You may visit the [Vision Government Solutions website](#) for more detailed information on the revaluation process, and answers to frequently asked questions. During the month of June and continuing through September, Vision personnel will be driving through Glastonbury and reviewing all properties to update the Assessor's database. An "Assessor's Office" sign will also be posted in the vehicle window, and their car will be registered with the Glastonbury Police Department as well as the Assessor's Office at Town Hall.

## TAX RESOURCES

### TAXES AND MOTOR VEHICLE ADJUSTMENTS

Tax bills will be mailed June 30, 2022. The first installment of Real Estate and Personal Property taxes on the Grand List of October 1, 2021 are due July 1, 2022 and payable by August 1, 2022. The Motor Vehicle Tax is due July 1, 2022, and payable by August 1, 2022. If you have a bill for a motor vehicle you no longer own, the Assessor can adjust it with the proper documentation.
