# **Health News**

The Centers for Disease Control & Prevention (CDC) recommends that everyone over the age of 6 months get a flu shot every year. The Flu is a serious contagious disease that can lead to hospitalization and sometimes death. A flu vaccine is the first and most important step in protecting against flu viruses. Get vaccinated to avoid getting the flu/giving the flu to your family and friends!

According to immunize.org, vaccination should begin in September through, and before the end of October. (Learn more at immunize.org.) Each fall, the Glastonbury Health Department offers clinics during this timeframe to provide the influenza vaccine to town residents. See clinic date details below as available.


