Age-Friendly Community Initiative

October 20th Community Conversation:

will include a brief overview of the initiative and progress to date followed by break-out group discussions of the three priority Domains of Livability and future planning related to the eight Domains.

Senior Center Reaccreditation

Patti asked the members for recommendations of residents to serve on the Self-Assessment Reaccreditation committee. Outreach will be done to former participants, members of the Age-Friendly community Core Leadership Team and community volunteers.

Accessibility to Town Athletic Fields

Lisa Zerio reported on several efforts that are underway in town to improve accessibility to town fields. She also reported that the improvements to the fields at the high school would be part of a long-term comprehensive plan and could be very costly due to the existing terrain and layout of the area.

Inclusionary Zoning Ordinance

The members discussed the proposed Amendments for Inclusionary Zoning and agreed to send a letter of general support for efforts in town that align with the Age-Friendly Community Action Plan to increase affordable housing opportunities for residents and seniors looking to downsize.
