Refuse & Recycling Updates

Expanded Food Waste Recycling Program

Did you know that food waste recycling reduces overall waste tonnage and associated expenses, and converts the material into renewable energy? You could say that one man's trash is another man's energy source! To encourage food recycling, the Town has installed a new food recycling satellite container behind Town Hall, now available for public use. Residents may also continue to recycle their food waste at the Transfer Station (permit required). Do your part to reduce our waste and take the Food Scraps Pledge today! Community members who pledge to recycle their food waste can also receive a free starter kit! Beginning Saturday, April 1, residents can obtain a free starter kit from the following locations during standard operating hours, and while supplies last: Town Sanitation Office, Transfer Station, Bulky Waste Facility, or the Town Hall Customer Service Center. Extended DST Wednesday Hours at Transfer Station

Compost Bin/Rain Barrel Sales & Pick-up Event - 4/29

This Spring, the Town is hosting its annual Compost Bin and Rain Barrel Sales and Pickup event. Residents may purchase rain barrels, compost bins, and related products through 4/28 for pick-up at Academy on 4/29.

Composting is an excellent way to reduce the volume of trash going into landfills! It also improves soil structure and moisture retention, and contributes to healthy plant growth.

Rain Barrels reduce water costs, improve local water quality, prevent erosion, provide water during droughts, and provide a natural source of water for plants and gardens - all while reducing the amount of pollutants that enter our storm drains!

Residents may purchase rain barrels, compost bins, and related items through the online store through April 28th. Items must be picked up at the Academy parking lot on Saturday, 4/29 between 9:00 AM and 12:00 PM. <u>Learn more here</u>.



Spring Safety for Pedestrians from the Glastonbury PD

Spring has arrived, and as the weather gets warmer, an increasing amount of people will be out walking, running, and enjoying the sunshine, and taking advantage of the vast sidewalk network throughout the community - especially on Main Street and around the Town Center. Soon, the crosswalk signs that sit in the middle of the road will be back in place after their winter break. These signs, coupled with the large signs on the side of the road indicating the location of a crosswalk (and electronic flashing signals in some instances, e.g. on Glastonbury Blvd and in front of The Tannery on New London Turnpike), are all reminders for drivers of where they must yield to pedestrians.



In 2021, Connecticut changed the crosswalk law to include not only pedestrians within any portion of the sidewalk, but also when the pedestrian "steps to the curb at the entrance to the crosswalk and indicates his or her intent to cross the roadway by raising his or her hand and arm toward oncoming traffic; or indicates his or her intent to cross the roadway by moving any part of his or her body or an extension thereof, including, but not limited to, a wheelchair, cane, walking stick, crutch, bicycle, electric bicycle, stroller, carriage, cart or leashed or harnessed dog, into the crosswalk at the entrance to the crosswalk." In fact, the only time a vehicle has the right of way at a crosswalk is an emergency vehicle with activated lights and sirens. A violation of these laws can cost a driver a hefty fine!

Tips for Pedestrian Safety:

- If there are NO crosswalks marked on the roadway, <u>pedestrians must yield to vehicular traffic</u>.
- Jaywalking (crossing an intersection diagonally) is ILLEGAL in Connecticut.
- Always be aware of your surroundings and the speed limit in the area you are crossing to ensure drivers have enough warning to stop for you.
- Be extra conscious when crossing the street during busy times of the day/peak traffic hours, especially at sunset/sunrise and in the night hours.
- When sidewalks are NOT present, walk/run AGAINST traffic flow to avoid having your back to approaching traffic.
- Keep in mind that using the roadway as a pedestrian in a negligent or reckless manner can result in a fine.
- The use of bicycles, electric bicycles, and electric foot scooters are <u>prohibited</u> on sidewalks and are to be used in the bike lane or shoulder of the road, in the same direction as the flow of traffic.

The Glastonbury Police Department appreciates your cooperation in following these important safety measures. The roadway can be a dangerous place, particularly for pedestrians, and it is important to be aware and attentive to your surroundings to prevent accidents and unnecessary injury.
