Mr. Manfre updated the Commission on the Parker Terrace Pump Station bid award letter and explained that it was sent to the Town Manager's office but has been delayed due to the new Town Manager transition.

The Commission inquired about a recent issue at the Smith Brook Pump station and Mr. Manfre explained that rocks and grit accumulated in the wet well and damaged the pump. This required immediate replacement of the pump over the weekend. Mr. Manfre noted that there was a spare pump on the shelf. He had ESI come in and clean the wet well. Mr. Manfre also stated that there is about an hour window of pump station storage before this begins to cause a major issue.

Mr. Horvath SECONDED the MOTION and it was APPROVED unanimously.
