Re: Town Manager's Report

Dear Council Members:

The following will keep you up-to-date on various topics.

1. Showing Appreciation for Town Staff

I have provided you with several "thank you notes" that were recently written by the public for the purpose of expressing appreciation to Town staff for their excellent work.

Another way that staff are shown appreciation is via the Town's annual Employee Recognition Program. The event, which is scheduled to be held at the Riverfront Community Center on Wednesday, June 14th from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m., will feature a catered breakfast (Spicy Green Bean) and an awards ceremony recognizing certain employees that have performed exceptionally. In an effort to encourage employees to attend, the Town Hall will be closed from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. on the day of the event. A press release (attached) has been issued to notify the public of the planned office closures and to provide suggested alternatives for addressing timely needs – e.g. paying taxes, renewing dog licenses, etc. We have also posted prominent notices to the Town website and physical signage at Town facilities.

2. <u>Public, Educational and Governmental Programming and Educational Technology Investment</u> Account (PEGPETIA) Grant

In 2007, the Connecticut General Assembly established the PEGPETIA program to promote and improve public, educational, and governmental programming and to support education technology initiatives. Glastonbury was recently awarded a \$95,804 PEGPETIA grant which will be used to upgrade the Riverfront Community Center (RCC) PA and sound system. The upgrade will allow us to conduct remote and hybrid meetings, as well as provide the ability to share equipment between Council Chambers, Town Hall Meeting Room A, and the RCC. This 100% grant funded project is targeted for a fall 2023 completion.

This is the third PEGPETIA grant the Town has been awarded since 2019. The previous grants, one for \$147,000 and the other for \$44,000, allowed us to upgrade the broadcast system, PA system and sound system in the Town Hall.

3. Bicycle Friendly Community Award Designation

The League of American Bicyclists has renewed Glastonbury's designation as a Bronze-Level Bicycle Friendly Community. This award is presented to communities with strong commitments to bicycling. A national press release is available online at www.bikeleague.org. This designation is valid for four years.

4. Police Marine Patrol

The Glastonbury Police Department's marine patrol boat has been serviced and is stationed indoors at the Boathouse. As staffing and weather permit, it will be deployed to monitor recreational boat traffic along the Connecticut River. As in previous years, Police Chief Porter will reach out to the Police Chiefs in surrounding river towns in an effort to coordinate patrol efforts on a regional basis.

5. Auto Theft & Violence Grant funded by the Federal American Rescue Plan Act

The State of Connecticut Department of Emergency Protection has provided the Glastonbury Police Department with \$35,000 of federal ARPA funds for the purpose of reducing the commission of auto theft and other crimes associated with auto theft. Funding will pay for increased police patrols to help deter these criminal acts from taking place. Glastonbury is one of 58 communities in the state to have been awarded this grant funding.

6. Automated License Plate Readers (ALPR)

The majority of permits necessary to install the Automated License Plate Readers (ALPR units) have been received. Outstanding permits should be received by end of this month. Once all permitting is in place, the installation will begin. It is anticipated that installation will take a few weeks, after which training and testing will occur. ALPR unit locations are listed below:

- 6. Griswold Street/Bantle Road
- 7. Route 17 (area of #1361)
- 8. Manchester Road/New London Turnpike
- 9. Neipsic Road (area of #799)

- 10. Putnam Boulevard/Naubuc Avenue
- 11. Glastonbury Boulevard/Route 3 (eastbound traffic)
- 12. Main Street/Griswold Street
- 13. Hebron Avenue/Route 2 East off-ramp
- 14. Manchester Road/Route2 West off-ramp
- 15. New London Turnpike/Sycamore Street
- 16. Neipsic Road/Route 2 West on-ramp
- 17. Main Street/East Hartford town line

7. Welles Village Playground

Recently, 197 surveys were sent to Welles Village residents with a deadline for submission of May 15th. Twenty-four surveys were received, offering helpful input. Parks and Recreation Director Lisa Zerio will be meeting soon with a playground consultant that will create design options. On a related note, the Town is awaiting quotes for repairs/renovations to the Welles Village Park basketball court renovations.

8. Salmon Brook Park

Salmon Brook Park is a Town park located in the Town Center behind the Glen Lochen Mall on New London Turnpike (see attached map). It offers passive recreation in the form of benches overlooking a fishing pond. Town staff have recently examined the pond and made two observations. First, the pond was constructed in the 1970's. An inlet structure allows entry of water flow to the pond from the Salmon Brook located on the east end of the pond, with a corresponding outlet structure on the west side of the pond to allow for pond overflow back to Salmon Brook. Second, the realignment of the inlet structure coupled with alteration of stream bottom /water level elevations have resulted in it being difficult for brook flow to enter the pond except during high intensity rain events. This has resulted in citizens expressing concern about low pond levels.

At present, the Town Engineer and I feel that there are three options available: 1) Pursue a capital project aimed at keeping the pond full of water, which likely require federal and local regulatory permits that could take a year or more to obtain; 2) Pursue a capital project aimed at eliminating the pond and restoring the site to the former natural condition without significant modification to Salmon Brook; or 3) Do nothing. I anticipate providing greater detail on these three options as part of the fall budget process.

9. Wrong Way Signs with Flashers Project

The Connecticut Department of Transportation (DOT) is in the process of designing Wrong Way Detection Systems to be installed at 42 limited access highway off-ramps that are considered high risk for wrong-way drivers. The Route 3 Eastbound exit at Glastonbury Boulevard and the Route 3 Westbound exit at Putnam Boulevard would be included in this project.

These types of systems may consist of radar, video, and/or thermal cameras deployed along off-ramps as primary detection for wrong-way vehicles. Flashing red circular lights on the signs will alert drivers that they are traveling in the wrong direction and to take corrective action. The State Police and the CT DOT would be alerted if a driver continues the wrong way. The designs are scheduled for completion this month, with the project tentatively scheduled to be advertised to contractors later this summer.

10. FY 2024 State Grant Revenue to Glastonbury

The Connecticut General Assembly adopted a two-year budget this week. Assuming Governor Lamont executes, below is a chart that compares what Glastonbury budgeted for State aid in Fiscal Year 2024 with what the State budgeted. The net result is that the Town will be receiving \$149,134 more than what is budgeted. Furthermore, I have received news from Representative Barry that the State's adopted budget contains no grant funding for specific municipal capital projects in Glastonbury. Representative Barry did say that she will be going through the adopted budget in depth as monies were earmarked for affordable housing initiatives via a grant process.

11. Parking of Commercial and Recreational Vehicles on Residential Properties

The Director of Planning and Land Use Services is drafting text amendments to Section 7 of the Building Zoning Regulations with respect to the parking of larger vehicles in residential driveways. I will bring it forward to the agenda / leadership team once it is ready.

12. Naubuc School Alterations Project

Following a publicly advertised, competitive bid process, Glastonbury Public Schools (The School District) has awarded the contract for the Naubuc School Alteration Project to BRD Builders, LLC of Hartford. BRD's base bid is \$3,211,800. The Town Capital budget contains \$3.2M for the project. Any expenditure associated with the project that exceeds \$3.2M will be paid for by the School District. I have attached a summary of the bids received, as well as an award letter from The School District to BRD.

13. 2023 Riverfront Music Series

The 2023 Riverfront Music Series presented by the Town of Glastonbury and the Chamber of Commerce kicks off June 21st at 6:30 pm at the Riverfront Community Center. Information about each of the eight upcoming concerts is attached.

Subject: Thank you

I don't know if I'm sending this to the appropriate address. I am trying to identify two of your officers who assisted me in a recent situation, so that I can contact them to thank them for their competence and kindness. This is NOT a complaint; quite the opposite. I failed to get the officers' names at the time, and intended to contact the department afterwards, but events distracted me.

On January 28th this year, my wife had a serious medical emergency arising from a long battle with cancer. I called 911, and the dispatcher coached me in CPR while they dispatched responders. Your two officers, a man and a woman, arrived within minutes and took over the CPR until the arrival of the EMTs, who worked on for half an hour until they confirmed what I already knew by then. She was gone.

The two police officers were incredibly helpful and kind. They asked whether I had a preference of funeral home, suggested one, and contacted the place themselves to save me the additional trouble and pain. And then they waited until the funeral home people arrived. It was a cold day, and they sat in their car waiting. I invited them to wait in the house, but they wanted to give me my own space to begin processing my grief, and that was welcome. I had a few minutes to sit alone with body and begin the long process of saying goodbye to my wife of 47 years, a process that continues today.

I assume that the officers can be identified from department logs. I would like to get their names and contact information so that I can thank them. And I believe they deserve commendation from the department and the town. They did their job in exemplary fashion, and they're nice people. That should be acknowledged.

When the Glastonbury Police were contacted regarding the need for a Russian interpreter, it was learned that Officer Sergey Sharov spoke Russian and was available to assist us with the death notification. It is my understanding that Officer Sharov was invaluable in making the death notification and it was extremely comforting to the family that we were able to have the presence of an officer who spoke their native language. Putnam Officer Kris Bernier was very vocal about his praise for Officer Sharov.

I was also informed Officer Sharov had a family commitment last evening and still he was more than willing to work beyond his assigned shift to assist us. I cannot thank you enough for providing him but more importantly please extend my gratitude and thanks to him. He truly made a difference in the midst of a terrible time for this family. His dedicated presence exemplified the best of the Glastonbury Police Department.


