## Fireworks Safety Tips from the GPD

The Glastonbury Police Department (GPD) urges community members to take the following safety precautions this summer, and particularly over the Independence Day holiday week:

- 1. If you are using fountains, or attending a public fireworks display, be sure to watch from a safe distance
- 2. Call 911 immediately if an injury occurs as a result of fireworks
- 3. Be careful and use your best judgment, even when using sparklers and fountains, which burn at 1800 degrees. Any device that emits sparks can cause severe burns and serious physical injury.
- 4. Consider your environment anything flammable can potentially cause structure fires and brush fires
- 5. Keep a bucket of water nearby to fully extinguish anything flammable
- 6. NEVER...
  - Allow children to handle any type of firework, noisemaker, or explosive
  - Pickup or attempt to re-light a device that has not ignited fully
  - Use fireworks while impaired by drugs or alcohol
  - Light explosives indoors
  - Point/throw explosives at another person

## Paving Work Scheduled for July 2023

The Town will begin paving work on town roads/streets this July. Paving operations will include grinding of old road surface followed by grading and compacting, and top course paving. The work schedule is outlined below, including approximate start dates for each location. Please note that preparatory work, e.g. curb removal, may start sooner, and the overall schedule is subject to change based on weather conditions and other factors. Project work may take 2-3 weeks to complete.

Paving to be completed this July includes the following roads/streets:

Paving operations will occur Monday – Friday, between the hours of 7:00 AM – 6:00 PM, with Saturday work scheduled as necessary. One-way traffic and detours are to be expected during working hours with flaggers and/or Police present to help direct traffic and advise of changes in traffic patterns. Motorists, bicyclists, and pedestrians are advised to practice caution in the work area, and to please heed all posted signs and detours.

Homeowners with irrigation systems who reside on the streets noted above should please mark or remove all sprinkler heads adjacent to the road's edge or curb line, and shut off applicable zones prior to the onset of work and through completion. Letters will be delivered to all impacted property owners to further outline these instructions.

This work is being done as part of the <u>Town's Annual Street Paving Program</u>. Additional paving work is planned for August and September with approximate timelines to be announced once finalized.

We appreciate your patience as we work to maintain the quality of Town roads/streets.

## Town Reaffirms Strong Bond Ratings

Moody's and S&P recently affirmed the Town of Glastonbury's bond ratings at Aaa and AAA respectively, the highest ratings available. As part of their report, Moody's referenced the Town's "robust reserves and liquidity supported by stable property tax revenues" and "low leverage and fixed costs" referencing the Town's manageable debt and pension liabilities. They also mentioned "management's conservative budgetary practices" as a credit strength. S&P's report mirrored many of Moody's sentiments and acknowledged the Town's "well-embedded and comprehensive policies and practices, including a long-term financial and capital plan, and formalized policies for investments, debt, and reserves, supported by a very strong institutional framework" and "annual surpluses, supporting a high reserve and liquidity position" as key characteristics to the maintenance of the AAA rating.

## Food Waste Diversion Program Implemented at RCC Kitchen

The Town of Glastonbury is pleased to report the successful implementation of a food scraps recycling program at the Riverfront Community Center. Sanitation Superintendent, Mike Manfre, coordinated with Human Services and Facilities staff to develop and launch a clean system for separating food scraps generated during the senior lunch program. This program provides 25-35 meals each day, and all of the food waste generated will now be diverted from the waste stream and converted into renewable energy. Kudos to this cross-departmental team for implementing the first kitchen diversion program in Glastonbury!

## **Updated Wall of Honor in Town Hall!**

The Town has updated its Wall of Honor located on the lower level of Town Hall. This display has been in place for many years, and is designed to help recognize Glastonbury residents who bravely served, (or continue to serve), in the U.S. Military. ## Town Closes on Purchase of Rose's Berry Farm

The Town is pleased to announce that it has finalized the purchase of Rose's Berry Farm, a property that encompasses nearly 23.2 acres on Matson Hill Road. Back in 2018, Glastonbury purchased the Development Rights to the 52+ acre parcel through a cooperative agreement with Belltown Hill Orchards (fee interest). On May 25, 2023 the Town finalized the \$1.09M sale of the 23+ acres. This purchase was made possible through the Town's Land Acquisition and Preservation Program and a recently successful bond sale. Glastonbury is delighted to have the opportunity to support the preservation of this agricultural land. Following the closing, the Glastonbury Town Council authorized the Town Manager to enter short-term lease agreements with two local farmers.
