Glastonbury residents who rented in 2022, and were age 65 or older by 12/31/2022, or those receiving Social Security Disability may be eligible for a rebate if their 2022 income was \$40,300 or less for a single person or \$49,100 or less for a married couple. There is no asset limit for this program. Proof of 2022 income received and 2022 rent, heat, electricity and water expenses are required. Additional Veteran's Exemption - Applications for Additional Veteran's Exemption from property tax are being taken through Friday, September 29, 2023. Income limits, based on 2022 income, are \$40,300 for an individual and \$49,100 for a married couple. Income includes Social Security, all interest, taxable and non-taxable income. You are required to provide a copy of your federal income tax return, if filing, and/or copies of all your interest and income statements and also the Social Security end-of-year statement (SSA-1099).
