Updates from the Sanitation Department and WPCA

Transfer Station Hours

The Transfer Station (TS) is open for extended WEDNESDAY hours, (7:00 AM - 6:00 PM), from Sept. 27 - Oct. 25. Beginning November 1, the Wednesday hours will revert back to the 7:00 AM - 3:00 PM schedule. Learn more here. WPCA Public Hearing re: Sewer Use Rate - October 11th

The Water Pollution Control Authority (WPCA) will host a Public Hearing as part of their regular meeting on Wednesday, October 11th to discuss the proposed adjustment to the sewer use rate

for the November 2023 billing period. The WPCA has recommended a 3% rate increase, from \$3.30/ccf to \$3.40/ccf, to cover the increased costs of electricity and diesel fuel. The WPCA meeting is open to the public, and will be held in-person at 6:00

PM in the Town Hall Council Chambers.

Changes to State Bottle Law

Earlier this year, the State of Connecticut expanded the \$0.05 bottle deposit to include juice, sports drinks, tea/coffee, kombucha, and other items. (See expanded list here.) Effective January 1, 2024, the state will also increase the bottle deposit to \$0.10/item. According to DEEP, the state only sees a 45% redemption on bottles and cans, leaving an approximate \$30-\$40 million in unredeemed deposits. Residents are encouraged to recycle bottled items to redeem the deposit.
