The town of Glastonbury deserves a new, modern animal shelter to serve as a safe temporary home for not just dogs but cats, birds, rabbits, turtles and any other domestic animal rescued. The new Shelter will service Glastonbury's community for the next 50 plus years, so spending the dollars now for a bigger, modern shelter would be money well spent and a benefit for Glastonbury. I do not support the location near a bus yard as the diesel fumes will be toxic to the animals, the noise of the buses would scare the dogs and no safe place to walk a shelter dog. I would recommend these few locations to think about building the shelter, Old Maids Lane next to bulky waste, field across from Riverfront Park or Arbor Acres park. Thank you.
