Town Manager's Report

Dear Council Members:

The following will keep you up to date on various topics.

1. Weekly Update from Glastonbury Emergency Medical Services

Attached are recent weekly updates from GEMS.

2. Glastonbury Farmers Market Relocating to Town Hall for 2024 season

The Glastonbury Farmers Market will open for the season on Wednesday, June 5, 2024 and continue weekly from 4:00 PM – 7:00 PM each Wednesday through September. This year, all Farmers Market events will be held on the Town Hall campus lawn near the flag poles. Previously hosted at Hubbard Green, the Farmers Market staff believe the new location will result in increased attendance. Community members often visit the Town Hall campus to take advantage of the walking trails, dog park, athletic fields, and town programming, and both parties are hopeful that the new arrangement will improve community access to locally grown food and homemade products. 3. Welles Park Playground Ribbon Cutting Ceremony

Town staff is busy installing new playground equipment at Welles Park, with the goal of completing installation by mid-April. A ribbon cutting ceremony is planned at the Welles Park Playground on Thursday, May 16th at 3:30 p.m. The playground is expected to be complete in April and open for use. The event will include a Youth and Family Program, ice cream truck, and other activities that are currently being planned.

4. North Central Area Agency on Aging (NCAAA) Grant

Senior Center Supervisor Ronda Guberman has submitted a grant proposal to the North Central Area Agency on Aging (NCAAA). If awarded the grant, up to \$14,000 would go towards enhancing our foot care program, fitness center scholarships, and outreach activities for low-income seniors in Town.

5. Demand is High for Parks & Recreation Programs

March 12th was opening day to register for the upcoming season of Parks & Recreation Programs. By 4:30 p.m., there were 3,846 registrations with revenues totaling \$876,759. In 2023, those figures were 2,918 and \$614,375 respectively. Camp/program registrations will continue, and swim registrations will begin in June.

6. Campaign to Prevent Stormwater Pollution

The Town is running a social media campaign during March and April that is geared towards preventing stormwater pollution. Posts will be shared through the general Town Facebook page. Staff will also include stormwater info in the Town's April newsletter. Attached are some materials that will be posted online.

7. Board of Finance Sets Mill Rate

At its meeting of Friday, March 22nd, the Board of Finance voted to set a Real Estate, Personal Property and Motor Vehicle mill rate of 31.93, calculated at a 99.20% collection rate in accordance with the FY 2024/2025 adopted budget. The 31.93 mill rate is the same mill rate calculated at the Town Council's final budget meeting.

8. Town Hosting Spring 2024 Compost Bin and Rain Barrel Sale

From now through May 2nd, Glastonbury residents can purchase rain barrels, compost bins, and related products from the Town at 50% off retail prices. Orders must be placed by no later than May 2nd and picked up at the Academy parking lot on Saturday, May 4th between 8:00 and 10:00 a.m. The online store is available at www.glastonburyct.gov/compost. 9. Parent/Caregiver Support Groups

This spring, Glastonbury Youth & Family Services (Y&FS) and the Glastonbury Public Schools are cosponsoring a series of support groups for local caregivers. The groups will offer a safe and non-judgmental environment for parents and caregivers to share their challenges and gain new insights. Group sessions will be held on Wednesday evenings at the Y&FS Annex Building from 6:30 - 8:30 p.m. beginning April 3rd and continuing for six weeks.



If you wash your car/vehicle on a driveway or other paved surface, soap and other cleaning substances flow down into community storm drains. These chemicals ultimately end up in Glastonbury's water bodies, which can damage wildlife and water quality.

Always wash your car on GRASS or GRAVEL surfaces, or at a commercial car wash, to help reduce water pollution.

Did you know that heavy rain can cause excess fertilizer to pass into storm drains and travel to Glastonbury's local bodies of water? Fertilizer pollutes community water and can also effect oxygen levels for various fish species.

When planning your lawn fertilization, check the weather and AVOID fertilizing before heavy rain or severe storms.

It's also best practice to sweep up excess fertilizer from paved surfaces to ensure it doesn't end up in our storm drains/water sources.

Spring Cleaning season has arrived and the Town is encouraging local business owners to sweep their parking lots to rid them of any debris/substances that could potentially wash away into community storm drains!

Keeping lawn fertilizers, de-icers, and other substances OUT of the storm drains helps keep Glastonbury water sources free from pollution!

Community businesses are also encouraged to clean parking lot drainage systems annually (e.g. catch basins, swales, etc.) to eliminate accumulated sediment and debris.
