The Town of Glastonbury is seeking bids for work required to replace the existing roofs at The Museum on the Green, 1944 Main Street and the Highway Garage Truck Shed, 2380 New London Turnpike, Glastonbury, CT

Bid forms may be obtained at the Office of the Purchasing Agent, Town Hall, 2155 Main Street, Glastonbury, Connecticut 06033 (second level) or on the Town's website at www.glastonbury-ct.gov.

A non mandatory pre-bid meeting and site walk through will be held at the Highway Truck Shed, 2380 New London Turnpike on October 3rd, 2013 at 11:00 a.m.. Contractors shall comply with State Statutes concerning Employment, and Labor Practices, if applicable, and Section 31-53 of the Connecticut General Statutes as amended (Prevailing wages), including annual adjustments in Prevailing Wages. Certified payrolls will be required bi-weekly. Sealed bids must be accompanied with Bid Security. Bid Security shall be issued payable to the "Town of Glastonbury" in the form of a certified check or Bid Bond in an amount not less than 10% of the total amount of the base bid. The Bid Bond must be issued by a surety company licensed in the State of Connecticut. Cashier's checks will not be accepted.

The Town reserves the right to waive informalities or reject any part of, or the entire bid, when said action is deemed to be in the best interest of the Town. All Sealed Bids must be submitted to the Office of the Purchasing Agent no later than the time and date indicated. All bids will be publicly opened and read.

The Town of Glastonbury is an Affirmative Action/Equal Opportunity Employer. Minority / Women /Disadvantaged Business Enterprises are encouraged to bid.

- 1. Sealed bids (one original and one copy) on the attached Bid Forms will be received at the Office of the Purchasing Agent, Town Hall, 2155 Main Street, Glastonbury, Connecticut, 06033 (second level). At the designated time of opening, they will be publicly opened, read, recorded and placed on file.
- 2. Whenever it is deemed to be in the best interest of the Town, the Town Manager, Purchasing Agent or designated representative shall waive informalities in any and all bids. The right is reserved to reject any bid, or any part of any bid, when such action is deemed to be in the best interest of the Town of Glastonbury.
- 3. Bidders shall submit a Bid on a lump sum basis for each project. The basis of award will be based upon the bid for each project. The Town reserves the right to award each project separately.
- 4. Bids will be carefully evaluated as to conformance with stated specifications.
- 5. The envelope enclosing your bid should be clearly marked by bid number, time of bid opening, and date.
- 6. Specifications must be submitted complete in every detail and, when requested, samples shall be provided. If a bid involves any exception from stated specifications, they must be clearly noted as exceptions, underlined, and attached to the bid.
- 7. The Bid Documents contain the provisions required for the requested item. Information obtained from an officer, agent, or employee of the Town or any other person shall not affect the risks or obligations assumed by the Bidder or relieve him/her from fulfilling any of the conditions of the bid.
- 8. Each Bidder is held responsible for the examination and/or to have acquainted themselves with any conditions at the job site which would affect their work before submitting a bid. Failure to meet these criteria shall not relieve the Bidder of the responsibility of completing the bid without extra cost to the Town of Glastonbury.
- 9. Any bid may be withdrawn prior to the above-scheduled time for the opening of bids or authorized postponement thereof. Any bid received after the time and the date specified shall not be considered. No Bidder may withdraw a bid within sixty (60) days after the actual date of the opening thereof. Should there be reasons why a bid cannot be awarded within the specified period, the time may be extended by mutual agreement between the Town and the Bidder.
- 10. Each bid must be accompanied by a bid bond payable to the Town For ten percent (10%) of the total amount of the bid. The bid bond of the successful bidder will be retained until the payment bond and performance bond has been executed and approved, after which it will be returned. A certified check may be used in lieu of a bid bond. The Town of Glastonbury will not be liable for the accrual of any interest on any certified check submitted. Cashier's checks will not be submitted.
- 11. A 100% Performance and Payment bond is required of the successful bidder. This bond shall cover all aspects of the specification and shall be delivered to the Purchasing Agent prior to the issuance of a purchase order. The Performance and Payment Bond will be returned upon the delivery and acceptance of the bid items.
- 12. The Bidder agrees and warrants that in the submission of this sealed Bid, they will not discriminate or permit discrimination against any person or group of persons on the grounds of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, or physical disability including, but not limited to blindness, unless it is shown by such Bidder that such disability prevents performance of that which must be done to successfully

fulfill the terms of this sealed Bid or in any manner which is prohibited by the laws of the United States or the State of Connecticut: and further agrees to provide the Human Relations Commission with such information requested by the Commission concerning the employment practices and procedures of the Bidder. An Affirmative Action Statement will be required by the successful Bidder.

- 13. Bidder agrees to comply with all of the latest Federal and State Safety Standards and Regulations and certifies that all work required in this bid will conform to and comply with said standards and regulations. Bidder further agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Town for all damages assessed against the Town as a result of Bidder's failure to comply with said standards and/or regulations.
- 14. All correspondence regarding any purchase made by the Town of Glastonbury shall reference the Town's purchase order number. Each shipping container shall clearly indicate both Town purchase order number and item number.
- 15. Bidder is required to review the Town of Glastonbury Code of Ethics adopted July 8th, 2003 and effective August 1, 2003. Bidder shall acknowledge that they have reviewed the document in the area provided on the bid / proposal response page (BP). The selected Bidder will also be required to complete and sign an Acknowledgement Form prior to award. The Code of Ethics and the Consultant Acknowledgement Form can be accessed at the Town of Glastonbury website at www.glastonbury-ct.gov. Upon entering the website click on Bids & RFPs, which will bring you to the links for the Code of Ethics and the <a href="Consultant Acknowledgement Form. If the Bidder does not have access to the internet a copy of these documents can be obtained through the Purchasing Department at the address listed within this bid / proposal.
- 16. Any bidder, in order to be considered, shall be engaged primarily in the business of installing and servicing roofs with a minimum of five (5) years experience and have a valid contractor's license in the State of Connecticut. Each Bidder shall submit a list of similar projects completed within the last three years. Please provide project name and contact information for project coordinator (name, title, address, phone number). Please also provide contract value.

17. Non-Resident Contractors:

The Town is required to report names of non-resident (out-of-State) contractors to the State of Connecticut, Department of Revenue Services (DRS) to ensure that Employment Taxes and other applicable taxes are being paid by Contractors. A single surety bond for 5% of the entire contract price is required to be filed with DRS by any unverified nonresident prime or general contractor (if awarded) where the contract price for the project is \$250,000 or more. The contractor will be required to promptly furnish to the Town a copy of the Form AU-968 - Certificate of Compliance issued by the State of Connecticut, DRS. See State of Connecticut Notice SN 2012 (2).

- 18. Bidder shall include on a sheet(s) attached to its proposal a complete disclosure of all past and pending mediation, arbitration and litigation cases that the bidder or its principals (regardless of their place of employment) have been involved in for the most recent five years. Please include a statement of the issues in dispute and their resolution. Acceptability of Bidder based upon this disclosure shall lie solely with the Town.
- 19. Bidder or its principals, regardless of their place of employment, shall not have been convicted of, nor entered any plea of guilty, or nolo contendere, or otherwise have been found civilly liable or criminally responsible for any criminal offense or civil action. Bidder shall not be in violation of any

State or local ethics standards or other offenses arising out of the submission of bids or proposals, or performance of work on public works projects or contracts.

- 20. Municipal construction projects are exempt from Federal Excise Taxes, as well as, State of Connecticut Sales, Use and Service Taxes and should not be include in the Bidder's proposal.
- 21. After award of Contract, Owner will require the Contractor's schedule of Values, which shall be submitted at the preconstruction meeting. The Schedule of Values must accurately reflect job costs and include a complete breakdown of material and labor costs.

It is the respondent's responsibility to check the website for addenda prior to submission of any proposal.

Failure to comply with general rules may result in disqualification of the Bidder.

INSURANCE

The Bidder shall, at its own expense and cost, obtain and keep in force during the entire duration of the Project or Work the following insurance coverage covering the Bidder and all of its agents, employees and sub-contractors and other providers of services and shall name the **Town and the Board of Education its employees and agents as an Additional Insured** on a primary and non-contributory basis to the Bidders Commercial General Liability and Automobile Liability policies. These requirements shall be clearly stated in the remarks section on the Bidders Certificate of Insurance. Insurance shall be written with insurance carriers approved in the State of Connecticut and with a minimum Best's Rating of A-. In addition, all carriers are subject to approval by the Town. Minimum Limits and requirements are stated below:

1) Worker's Compensation Insurance:

- Statutory Coverage
- Employer's Liability
- \$100,000 each accident/\$500,000 disease-policy limit/\$100,000 disease each employee

2) Commercial General Liability:

- Including Premises & Operations, Products and Completed Operations, Personal and Advertising Injury, Contractual Liability and Independent Contractors.
- Limits of Liability for Bodily Injury and Property Damage Each Occurrence \$1,000,000
 Aggregate \$2,000,000 (The Aggregate Limit shall apply separately to each job.)
- A Waiver of Subrogation shall be provided

3) Automobile Insurance:

- Including all owned, hired, borrowed and non-owned vehicles
- Limit of Liability for Bodily Injury and Property Damage: Per Accident \$1,000,000

The Bidder shall direct its Insurer to provide a Certificate of Insurance to the Town before any work is performed. The Contractor shall be responsible to notify the Town 30 days in advance with written notice of cancellation or non-renewal. The Certificate shall evidence all required coverage including the Additional Insured on the General Liability and Auto Liability policies and Waiver of Subrogation on the General Liability policy. The Bidder shall provide the Town copies of any such insurance policies upon request.

INDEMNIFICATION

To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Bidder shall indemnify and hold harmless the Town and its consultants, agents, and employees from and against all claims, damages, losses and expenses, direct, indirect or consequential (including but not limited to fees and charges of engineers, attorneys and other professionals and court and arbitration costs) to the extent arising out of or resulting from the performance of the Bidder's work, provided that such claim, damage, loss or expense is caused in whole or in part by any negligent act or omission by the Bidder, or breach of its obligations herein or by any person or organization directly or indirectly employed or engaged by the Bidder to perform or furnish either of the services, or anyone for whose acts the Bidder may be liable.

1. TITLE OF SECTION:

1.1 **Technical Specifications**: Installation of new roof system including shingles, underlayment, drip edges, demolition and disposal of existing roof system.

2. SCOPE OF WORK:

2.1 Description of Work and Existing Conditions:

2.1.A Historical Society Museum on the Green:

The work under this specification shall include furnishing all labor, materials, tools, appliances and equipment, and performing all operations necessary for the removal of the existing roofing system in its entirety and the installation of a new roof system. The existing roof consists of one layer of asphalt shingles over one layer of wood sheathing installed approximately in 1990.

This work shall include, but is not limited to demolition of the existing roof system including removal and disposal of all existing roofing materials down to sheathing. Any unsuitable existing sheathing shall be identified to owner prior to removal. The new system will be a roof consisting of unlimited warranty architectural style shingle over a new underlayment and aluminum drip edge. Ice and water shield shall be installed along edges and ridgelines. All work will comply with all building codes as well as I-90 for wind loading. Successful vendor will be responsible to obtain all permits (Town portion of fees waived). Span rated plywood sheathing (if required) to be exterior grade and of a thickness appropriate for the support system installed with staggered joints 4' oc. (ACX as minimum type sheathing). Sketches of roof layouts included as Appendix A

2.1. B Vehicle Garage Truck Shed

The work under this specification shall include furnishing all labor, materials, tools, appliances and equipment, and performing all operations necessary for the removal of the existing roofing system as described in its entirety and the installation of a new roof system. The existing roof consists of one layer of asphalt shingles over plywood sheathing. The Town must be notified immediately of any unsuitable sheathing encountered after the shingles are removed.

This work shall include, but is not limited to demolition of the existing roof system including removal and disposal of all existing roofing materials down to sheathing. The southeast quadrant was re-roofed in December of 2012 and is not included in this project. The new system will be a roof consisting of unlimited warranty architectural style shingle to match existing over a new underlayment and aluminum drip edge. Ice and water shield will be installed at all edges, ridges, hips and valleys.

2.2 Products and Materials

Materials provided in this bid shall be those appropriate to perform work described under 2.1 including:

Asphalt Shingle Roofing: GAF Timberline with Unlimited Warranty and 5 year wind/shingle/labor warranty. Other acceptable manufacturers are: Owens-Corning Co., Elk Co. Shingles shall be glass fiber mat base, mineral granule surfaced type; 300lb/square self sealing

type; three dimensional design, staggered-edge butt type tab; color to be selected by Town. Provide special shapes for ridges, hips and others as applicable.

Nails: Standard round wire shingle of hot-dipped zinc coated steel; minimum 13.64 inch head diameter and 0.0880 inch shank diameter minimum 1¼ inch long and of sufficient length to penetrate through roof sheathing.

Sheet Metal Flashings: Copper Flashings: ASTM B370; cold rolled; 16 ounces per square foot. Pre-coated aluminum sheet metal trims and preformed drip edges 0.019 inch thick, color to be selected by Town.

Roof Sheathing to be minimum 3/4" ACX span rated plywood, staggered joints 4' o.c.

2.3 Submittals:

A brief narrative describing staff, methods and timing shall be submitted to the Town's Representative with the bid. Submittals for all materials shall be made to the Town for review prior to the start of work. Submittals for colors to be made within ten days of award. Submittals for longer lead time items shall be made in a manner to provide for timely execution of the work.

3. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS FOR ROOF REPLACEMENT

- 3.1 Scheduling shall be coordinated with the Town of Glastonbury's representative. The work is expected to be complete in the Fall of 2013 but must be complete by 20 June 2014. Materials brought on site shall be located so as to not interfere with the operation of the facility. The site will be available for review until bids are due. Contact Town Representative prior to arrival. The work shall proceed continuously from the start until the project is finished.
- 3.2 Materials removed from the site shall be transported in vehicles licensed for the material. Bidders will be allowed to dispose (fees waived) material from this project at the Town of Glastonbury Transfer Station and Bulky Waste Facilities subject to compliance with all rules and conditions of the facilities. It is the bidder's responsibility to become knowledgeable of the operating procedures of these facilities prior to use. Contact Solid Waste at 860.652.7772 for more information. All noncompliant loads will be rejected.

4. ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATIONS

4.1 Compliance:

Nothing in this specification shall be construed so as to violate any applicable provision of any local, state, or federal ADA regulation or code.

4.2 Other Materials and Accessories

The Bidder acknowledges and accepts that it is the intent of this section to provide the Town with a complete job. As such, the Bidder acknowledges and accepts that he shall be solely responsible for the inclusion and provision, within this bid, of the various and sundry materials and accessories required to complete the installation, and completion of said roofing replacement in conformance with these specifications at no additional cost to the Owner including meetings necessary to secure approval from Town agencies.

5. MEASUREMENT AND PAYMENT

5.1 Measurement

The material of this Section shall be measured by lump sum.

5.2 Payment

Payment for this Section shall be based on the bid summary sheet and the complete installation as accepted by the Town representative.

GENERAL CONSTRUCTION SPECIFICATIONS

01.00 WORKMANSHIP, MATERIALS AND EMPLOYEES

- 01.01 Wherever in this contract the word "Engineer" is used, it shall be understood as referring to the Building Superintendent of the Town of Glastonbury acting personally or through any assistants duly authorized.
- 01.02 The entire work described herein shall be completed in accordance with the plans and specifications to the full intent and meaning of the same. Unless otherwise specified, all materials incorporated in the permanent work shall be new, and both workmanship and material shall be of good quality. The Contractor shall, if required, furnish satisfactory evidence as to the kind and quality of materials.
- 01.03 The wording "furnish", "install", "construct", "furnish and install", or any similar terms, unless specifically noted to the contrary, shall include all labor, materials, water, tools, equipment, light, power, transportation, and any other services required for the completion of the work.
- O1.04 The Contractor shall at all times enforce strict discipline and good order among his employees, and shall seek to avoid employing on the work any unfit person or anyone not skilled in the work assigned to him.

02.00 SUPERINTENDENT

02.01 The Contractor shall keep on the work during its progress, in the absence of the Contractor, a competent Superintendent. The Superintendent shall be acceptable to the Engineer and shall fully represent the Contractor. All directions given to the Superintendent shall be binding as if given to the Contractor.

03.00 PRECONSTRUCTION MEETING

03.01 A Preconstruction Meeting will be held with the Engineer, Contractor, and any other interested parties prior to commencing any work. The Engineer shall arrange the meeting based on a mutually convenient time.

04.00 PERMITS

04.01 All permits, licenses, and fees required for the performance of the Contract work shall be secured and paid for by the Contractor. The local building permit fees will be waived.

05.00 PROPERTY ACCESS

- 05.01 The Contractor shall take all proper precautions to protect from injury or unnecessary interference, and provide proper means of access to abutting property where the existing access is cut off by the Contractor.
- 05.02 The Contractor shall take all proper precautions to protect persons from injury or unnecessary inconvenience and leave an unobstructed way along the public and private places for travelers, vehicles, and access to hydrants.

05.03 The Contractor shall make arrangements with the adjacent property owners for such trespass as he may reasonably anticipate in the performance of the work. All such arrangements shall be reported, in writing, to the Engineer.

06.00 PROTECTION OF THE PUBLIC AND OF WORK AND PROPERTY

- O6.01 The Contractor shall continuously maintain adequate protection of all work from damage, and shall take all reasonable precautions to protect the Town from injury or loss arising in connection with the Contract.
- O6.02 The Contractor shall adequately protect adjacent private and public property as provided by law and the Contract Documents.
- O6.03 The Contractor shall make good any damage, injury, or loss of work and to the property of the Town resulting from lack of reasonable protective precautions.
- O6.04 The buildings involved will be occupied during the construction period. The Contractor may be required to adjust his work schedule should the work have an adverse impact on operations. There will be no modification of the bid price should a schedule adjustment be required.

07.00 EXISTING IMPROVEMENTS

- 07.01 The Contractor shall conduct his work so as to minimize damage to existing improvements designated to remain. Except where specifically stated otherwise in the specifications, drawings, or as directed by the Engineer, it will be the responsibility of the Contractor to restore to their original condition, as near as practical, all improvements on public or private property. This shall include:
 - a. Property within and adjacent to the work area such as shrubs, walks, driveways, fences, etc.
 - b. Utility mains, ducts, poles, and services. The Contractor is hereby notified that utilities, if/where shown on the plans, are at approximate locations. These locations are subject to possible errors in the source of information and errors in transcription. The Contractor shall make certain of the exact location of all mains, ducts, poles, and services prior to excavation.

08.00 SEPARATE CONTRACTS

08.01 The Engineer reserves the right to let other contracts in connection with this work. The Contractor shall afford other contractors reasonable opportunity for the introduction and storage of their materials and the execution of their work, and shall properly connect and coordinate his work with theirs. Wherever work being done by the Town of Glastonbury forces or by other contractors is contiguous to work covered by this Contract, the respective rights of the various interests involved shall be established by the Engineer to secure the completion of the various portions of the work.

09.00 INSPECTION OF WORK

The Town shall provide sufficient personnel for the inspection of the work

O9.01 The Engineer shall at all times have access to the work whenever it is in preparation or progress, and the Contractor shall provide proper facilities for such access and for inspection.

- 09.02 If the specifications or the Engineer's instructions require any work to be specially tested or approved, the Contractor shall give the Engineer timely notice of its readiness for inspection and, if the inspection is by another authority other than the Engineer, of the date fixed for such inspection. Inspections by the Engineer shall be made promptly. If any work should be covered up without approval or consent of the Engineer, it must, if required by the Engineer, be uncovered for examination and properly restored at the Contractor's expense.
- 09.03 Re-inspection of any work may be ordered by the Engineer. If such work is found to be in accordance with the Contract Documents, the Town shall pay the cost of re-inspection and replacement. If such work is not in accordance with the Contract Documents, the Contractor shall pay such cost.

10.00 RIGHT TO INCREASE OR DECREASE WORK

10.01 The Town shall have the right to increase or decrease the amount of work herein specified as may be required.

11.00 RIGHT OF ENGINEER TO STOP WORK FOR WEATHER CONDITIONS

11.01 Should the work, in the opinion of the Engineer, be in danger by reason of inclemency of weather, or could not be finished in time to prevent such danger, the Contractor shall cease operations upon order of the Engineer, and shall not resume them until ordered to do so by the Engineer when the weather conditions are favorable. The Contractor shall, upon such orders, discontinue work, remove all materials or appliances for or in use upon the work, and place the premises in proper condition for use by the public during the time the work is suspended as herein provided, without cost to the Town.

12.00 CONTRACTOR TO BE RESPONSIBLE FOR IMPERFECT WORK OR MATERIALS

12.01 Any faithful work or imperfect material that may be discovered before the acceptance and the payment of the work shall be corrected upon the order of the Engineer. The acceptance and payment of the work does not in any manner relieve the Contractor of his obligation to construct work in the proper manner and the use of materials herein specified.

13.00 TOWN MAY NOTIFY CONTRACTOR IF WORK IS NOT CARRIED ON SATISFACTORILY

- 13.01 If, in the opinion of the Engineer, the Contractor is not proceeding with the work at a sufficient rate of progress so as to finish in the time specified, or has abandoned said work, or is not complying with the terms and stipulations or the Contract and specifications, the Engineer may serve notice on the Contractor to adopt such methods as will ensure the completion of the work in the time specified.
- 13.02 If, within five days after the Engineer has notified the Contractor that his work is not being carried on satisfactorily as before mentioned, the Engineer shall have the right to annul the Contract and manage the work under the direction of the Engineer, or re-let, for the very best interest of the Town as a new contract, the work under said new Contract shall be considered the responsibility of the defaulting Contractor.

13.03 Additional costs incurred over and above the original Contract shall be borne by the Performance Bond.

14.00 DEDUCTIONS FOR UNCORRECTED WORK

- 14.01 If the Engineer deems it inexpedient to correct work that has been damaged or that was not done in accordance with the Contract, an equitable deduction from the Contract price shall be made there for.
- 14.02 The Contractor shall promptly remove from the premises all materials condemned by the Engineer as failing to meet Contract requirements, whether incorporated in the work or not, and the Contractor shall promptly replace and re-execute his own work in accordance with the Contract and without expense to the Town, and shall bear the expense of making good all work by other contractors destroyed or damaged by such removal or replacement.
- 14.03 If the Contractor does not remove such condemned work and materials as promptly as possible after written notice, the Engineer may remove them and store the materials at the expense of the Contractor.

15.00 CLEANING UP

- 15.01 The Contractor must remove all debris of every description as the work progresses and leave the surroundings in a neat and orderly condition to the satisfaction of the Engineer.
- 15.02 Upon completion, and before acceptance and final payment, the Contractor shall remove from the site all equipment, forms, surplus material, rubbish and miscellaneous debris and leave the site in a neat and presentable condition.

16.00 ROYALTIES AND PATENTS

16.01 The Contractor shall pay all royalties and license fees. He shall defend all suits or claims for infringement of any patent rights and shall save the Town of Glastonbury harmless from loss on account hereof, except that the Town of Glastonbury shall be responsible for all such loss when a particular manufacturer, product, or process is specified by the Town of Glastonbury.

17.00 ERRORS OR CONFLICT IN DRAWINGS AND SPECIFICATIONS

- 17.01 The Contractor shall immediately notify the Owner/Engineer should he find any errors or conflicts in the contract documents. The Owner/Engineer shall render his interpretation or instruction in writing on the items as soon as possible.
- 17.02 Any work undertaken by the Contractor containing possible errors or conflicts will be done at his own risk unless he has received prior written approval from the Owner/Engineer
- 17.03 The Contractor shall be responsible for estimating and supplying all quantities, and where clarification or additional information is required, a request in writing to the Owner/Engineer shall be made. 


